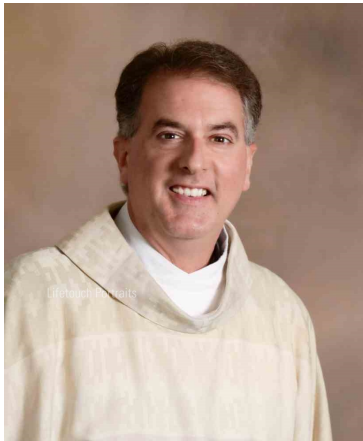

## FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8<sup>TH</sup> PASTOR:



### **Feast of the Holy Family & Happy New Year!**

We celebrate this grand opportunity of a few days focusing on the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. First over the LORD'S Day weekend we remember Luke's account of the Holy Family (Year C readings this weekend) in their annual visit to Jerusalem. They must have had a big family (that we don't hear/read anything about) for Jesus to get lost among the "friends and acquaintances."

We know many in our families who have wandered off and choose not to be part of a faith community and regularly go to church (our modern day Christian temple). That's so hard on many of our families and feels like a purposeful hurt to good parenting and care of families sacrificing to place their children in a Catholic school/environment.

What can be done now? A reminder about what is it that you worship! Is it God – and that worship is a "team sport" or faith thing we do together? Many folks are not aware of the difference of communal prayer and personal or private prayer. We are called to both so that we raise a hymn TOGETHER in praise to God, as scripture and early church tradition says. Or, are we about a sports team and worshipping this reality? Laws at one time protected worship in Muslim, Jewish and Christian activities, with no sports, shopping, gambling or drinking inhibiting "family time." As a people – a nation – we valued the need for God's worship. We lost these battles to the lobbies that choose to create new leisure activities in competition with worship. While we mourn the missing from our pews, synagogues and mosques, we interfaith leaders like you and your families ponder what can be done. CONTINUE TO INVITE! CONTINUE TO BE LOVING! CONTINUE TO SHARE THE GOOD NEWS, the music, the scripture, the words of wisdom and more you receive AND GIVE BACK to God through your worship. Tell them why you worship and how Father Lane misses you too! Then again, remember too, how God accepts those who are not with us. God's loving arm always being there to guide and support, even those who refuse to receive God's love and commandments. God is patient – and may we be so in the New Year too!

Furthermore, here's some other food for thought as we ponder with Mary the year ahead on Tuesday's solemnity of celebration (and for those who love the word – obligation): What draws us to grow more closely together as God's family? What must I listen and be open to from others to ponder anew in my heart? Who is missing in my life that may lead me to greater goodness with God?

Or, you may have a family member bring you Holy Communion with a pyx; this is the ritual we do as part of the Communion Rite at each Mass when we call forth ministers to go to the homebound, nursing home or hospital.
- **Join the Blessed Sacrament Community for the Liturgy of the Hours:** Morning Prayer is at 8:00 a.m. (for 20 minutes) and Evening Prayer at 4:45 p.m. for 15 minutes.
- **Join the Community @ Prayer Ministry:** Spend an hour in prayer during the day with the Blessed Sacrament in exposition or not. We have need for someone to fill the Wednesday at 3:00 p.m. timeslot and some other times too.
- **Complete Your Sacraments:** Adult folks (18 and over) who haven't received and celebrated their confirmation. Sundays in January, between the Masses, we have a class session. Contact George Peko.
- **Rosary?** Public recitation is at 8:30 a.m. Monday thru Saturday. We also recite a decade with school is in session at 7:30 a.m. to pray for the school and workday ahead, Monday thru Friday.
