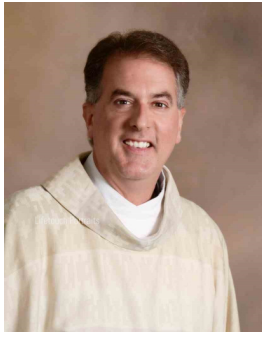

- **Complete Your Sacraments:** Adult folks (18 and over) who haven't received and celebrated their Confirmation are invited to meet for classes between Masses on Sundays in January, Contact George Peko.
- **Rosary?** Public recitation is at 8:30 a.m. Monday through Saturday. We also recite a decade when school is in session Monday through Friday at 7:30 a.m. We begin our 7:30 a.m. decade tomorrow, the return of school.
