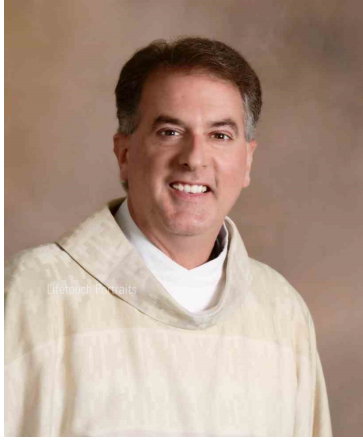

Feast of the Baptism of the LORD! We hear Luke's version of the Baptism of the LORD. There is not much detail about the actual ritual. We read that after everyone else was baptized, Jesus was baptized, almost as if this was the last baptism that John performed. Then the heavens opened and we hear he is beloved!

One of our Kindergarteners said this to me before Christmas break, and I thought I would share it: Jesus was so humble – and we have to be humble, too, and let our cousin baptize us! He was reminding me of what humbleness is about – service. The Prophet Isaiah proclaims in our first reading that service and the blessing it is to truly be humble and serve others. It's such a gift. All of us who serve know that when it is done for the good of another, we are so blessed by the action of loving humbleness. As we remember Christ's baptism, we remember our own and what God said at our baptism: you are a beloved child! That special phrase invites us to be in a lifetime of beloved care back to all of God's children. Let's recommit again to this new year of service in the LORD.
