2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time! A few of us may remember the liturgical history of this time of year. From Christmas until the Presentation of the LORD (February 2), there was a period of the 40 days of Christmas or the period of the “manifestation.” Each Sunday we celebrated a special “manifestation” of Christ’s, reminding us of the glory of God appearing in our world. So, traditionally, this Sunday, the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time, was a “manifestation Sunday,” taken from the Gospel of John to help us see

Christ’s first miracle and manifestation of his glory in this Gospel. These moments in Sacred Scripture help remind us of the daily manifestations of Christ in our world today. It helps us with the psalmist echo: Proclaim his marvelous deeds to all the nations. Where will you see Christ today? How will you be a manifestation of Christ today and this week?
