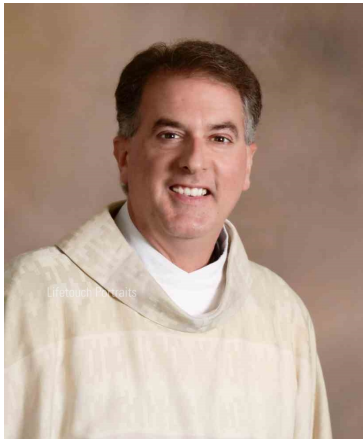

3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time! Today's readings now take us into the cycle of the Gospel of Luke and the continued readings for Ordinary Time. The grand entrance of Jesus in the synagogue at Capernaum begins His public ministry. "The Spirit of the LORD is upon me." There was disbelief. Isn't that the same disbelief we have in ourselves? This week is a good time to reconnect with our baptismal covenant to recognize the Spirit upon us – and the Body of Christ (the other reading for this day from the continuous reading of Paul's Letter to
