FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8TH PASTOR



8th Sunday in Ordinary Time: This year is one of the longest seasons of Ordinary Time before Lent in many years. Because of the way the calendar is with the date of Easter being later this year, we are able to hear more of Luke's Sermon on the Plain. Luke and Matthew took Jesus' first sermon or homily and put it in different settings, but still with the same teachings in an organized format. We are to recall our "blessedness" when we follow God's ways. Luke reminds us that "woe to those who don't follow God's ways." More specifically, today's Gospel

reminds us to put ourselves in one another's shoes first before we make harsh judgments. Do we ever think about the other's "backstory?" In my homily this weekend at Mass, I'm going to share a story from my favorite TV show *Lost*, and share how when we learn one another's history and family background, we can understand and have compassion - more compassion, for one another - and bear good fruit together!

We Begin Lent on Ash Wednesday this Week: February flew by! Now we enter in to the discipline of Lent and a retooling of our spiritual lives. Our spiritual lives are fortified during this time of annual renewal. I look forward to walking with you on this journey. Please note the following ways we can allow the season of Lent to guide us on the path to a new heart and spirit, through the seasons of the Sacred Triduum and Easter Time. These 96 days of renewal - up to Pentecost - are the church's way of helping us reinforce new habits and encouraging us to be faith disciples. What will you do? What will you give up? Let's try the following:

- **BIBLE STUDY:** Men gather Tuesdays in the parish office at 7:00 p.m. There is a women's group that meets on Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m.
- **WEEKDAY MASSES:** Come one day a week to one of our many weekday Masses in the church, the chapel or Saint Ann Shrine at 11:30 a.m.
- **SUNDAY MASS:** Come early to prepare the readings - give yourself more time with getting ready for Mass with your family - and get here in time to hear the great preludes and other musical pieces that our ministry works hard on preparing. Or for those who leave early from Mass - plan on staying for the entire liturgy.
- **MORNING OR EVENING PRAYER:** Join with the Blessed Sacrament Community that leads the prayers of the church, 8:00 a.m. or 4:45 p.m. weekdays. (20 minutes of prayers, intercessions, the recitation of the psalms)
- **PRAYER IN THE PRESENCE OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:** When driving in the area, make a visit to the chapel to spend more time in prayer, or even better, make an appointment with God by signing up for an hour of praying with the Community at Prayer ministry.

- **OPERATION RICE BOWL:** Make sure to have a rice bowl on your table (they will be in around the perimeter of the church) so that you may be in communion with those who need food. Follow the calendar that is provided to grow in our awareness of the needs of our brothers and sisters around the globe. Please return the Rice Bowl on Good Friday or Easter Sunday.
- **STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** Join in this special devotion Friday evenings at 7:00 p.m.
- **PLAN ON ATTENDING THE PARISH MISSION AND BRING OTHERS WITH YOU:** March 23 - 27 with Fr. Richard Fragomeni. We will have talks here at 7:00 p.m. at night, Tuesday during the Eymard Spiritual Group and also at Saint Clare after the morning Masses.
- **TAIZÉ PRAYER HOLY HOUR:** Monday, March 19, 7:00 p.m.
- Call a friend; visit the sick; volunteer in a ministry to share; live your discipleship and faith
- We will have the sacrament of reconciliation offered many times throughout the season - so please see the calendar that we will publish beginning next week, or by appointment with a priest.

And those Old Palm Branches: It's our annual custom to burn our old palms branches for the ashes. If you forgot to bring your palm branch back to church, have no fear! You may bring it back at any time. We invite you to bring them to the Fickel Narthex or at any time and then we will take care of them for you.

OUR WEEKLY STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Some folks have approached the Finance Council members to address the concern about "always asking for money." Yes, it seems that there is frequently an appeal for additional funds. In our history, the Roman Catholic Church, and specifically our parish, has been a major center of ministry and service. Be assured that I, along with the Finance Council, continuously watch over the financial health of our parish – with the school being the largest "line item" in the budget of the church (parish). We have a responsibility, a duty, to keep you in the know about the financial health of our faith community. Since many of our families choose not to tithe, we have multiple asks instead to meet our financial obligations. Basically, there are five different types of financial appeals:

Tithing. This is our primary source of funding our day-to-day operations at the parish (church and school). We are all called to tithe. Per the registration agreement signed before the beginning of this school year, each school parishioner household is obligated to tithe \$750, with the non-parishioner rate full tuition. This amount is to be paid from July through June (fiscal year).

Our 2015 Pastoral Plan stated transparency as a goal. We achieve this by publicizing our financial reports each week in the parish bulletin. Our goal is to list our expenses and to keep you "in the know" and see your "tithing at work!" We have a 3.2-million-dollar budget. This means that together our faith family must raise 3.2 million dollars through tuition, tithing, fundraising and grant-seeking. To help clarify our needs, here are our constant expenses:

- Every two weeks we have a payroll of \$83K.
- We have a monthly Blessed Sacrament Community (four of us) payroll of 16K.
- 26K in health benefits, 15K in retirement, utilities, maintenance (mostly paid by the parish), etc.

Since 1955, our parish has been dedicated to upholding a vibrant school that provides a quality, Catholic education, in a healthy, safe environment. Most recently the parish paid for the school roof over the early elementary wing the roof over Father O'Brien Hall and the school gymnasium roof. Maintenance campaigns, like roofs, windows and parking lots are not the most glamorous; however, they are quite necessary for the safety, and appearance of our campus. (Incidentally, parish projects are tax-deductible.)

Additional Parish Appeals. We periodically request funds for our Manna Ministry, that assists parishioners in emergency situations. We also have a collection for our Helping Hands Ministry that assists those less fortunate in the community. We also have regular collections to pay off our monthly roof loan. There are also yearly requests for help with Christmas and Easter flowers, for example.

Diocese-mandated collections. We also belong to the "larger" church, where we contribute to the ministry of the diocese and are called to support The Diocese of Cleveland. The diocese requires us to make annual appeals for causes such as the Church in Eastern Europe and Catholic Communications. We are currently in the midst of our Catholic Charities campaign, our face – Christ's face – to the most vulnerable and in need in northeast Ohio. Each year we are given a goal from the diocese so that each parish contributes to the larger 8-county goal. This year our parish's portion is \$163,000 of the 13.5 million diocesan goal.

Fundraisers. Several ministries and organizations hold various fundraisers throughout the year to supplement the budget. These activities/events also build community and offer the opportunity for fun such as our yearly Spring Fling Festival. In addition, we typically support campaigns such as Harvest for Hunger.

Capital Expenses. Occasionally, we need to raise funds to support a major capital expense. This is the case with our current driveway-parking lot (playground) campaign of a million dollars.

The Finance Council is sensitive to the many expenses and fees due this time of the year including Christmas bills, registration fees, athletic fees, tuition and other personal items. We chose to roll out our capital campaign in the fall of 2018 to inform and assist you in planning your personal budgets with your careful consideration and information toward your faith family's budget.

May our transparency and awareness support us together as we painstakingly care for **all our** homes. Thank you for your commitment to share God's blessings with your faith community.
