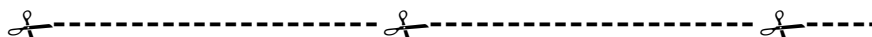

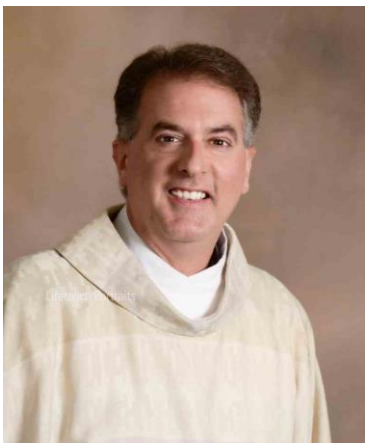

FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8TH PASTOR



First Sunday of Lent: It's finally here this year! The journey of Lent, a chance for us to get back to basics in our life and to give up, do more or just be a better witness of Christianity in our world. As we do each year, we go with Christ into the desert to reexamine our temptations in our life. I find it fascinating the three temptations that Satan put before Christ. It's a great reminder that we all have our own struggles and "temptations" that need some retooling in the next 40 days of our life. The number 40 in scripture is a special "device" to tell us that this is a "time of fulfillment."

What needs fulfilling in our life this year? How are we growing through fasting, prayer and almsgiving? These pillars of Lent, along with actions such as avoiding meat on Fridays, devotions (i.e. Stations of the Cross) and other activities are meant to guide us and help us become more fully ourselves. Even at church through, prayer, song, art or removal of the plants and the images of saints from around the sanctuary, we remind ourselves of "stripping" to get to our core. I hope, that as the opening prayer on Ash Wednesday reminded us, that as we "run the race of the discipline of Lent," it truly "will be a season of joy, conversion and renewal." We are in this together! Christianity is a team sport for worship, prayer and living our baptismal covenant.

Becoming Catholic: Lent serves a more ancient purpose: preparing folks to be initiated into the Church through Baptism, Confirmation and the reception of Holy Communion. This Sunday at the 10:00 a.m. Mass we will acknowledge those among us who have been preparing for the sacraments. These catechumens will participate in the ritual to send them from our parish to the Cathedral of Saint John, downtown, with Bishop Perez. Bishop Perez, as our local ordinary/bishop, is required to acknowledge the faith that is forming in every Catholic Christian in our diocese. But since he is unable to come to every Easter Vigil around the diocese, he first "elects" or chooses to have pastors assist in this role. Additionally, Bishop Perez (and bishops all around the world in every diocese) says to those becoming Catholic, "God chooses you, or 'elects' you to become a Christian." God has chosen the following, and we pray for them as we celebrate the special Lenten rites this season: **Catechumens 2019** – Adults: Scott Schrey, Barbara Margevicius, Brittany Fleming, Aileen Rosenberg, Colleen Mockenden, Children: Brooklyn Layne, Miranda Royster-Malone, Miranda Andru, and Caleb Gianzero. **Candidate Seeking full reception** - Tammy Oley.

I hope you'll plan on being with us during the Easter Vigil, the "super bowl" of Christian worship this Saturday, April 20, to participate in their initiation and our own renewal of our baptismal covenant. The service is at 8:30 p.m. I'll share more about this sacred night in a few weeks in the bulletin. Stay tuned!

Speaking of praying... Our parish has been financially challenged this year and I pray that as you have had your own financial struggles, you know that we are in a special communion of "penny pinching." As we start preparing our parish budget for next year, we are mindful that in our dynamic and wonderful parish, it takes a lot of funds to run this great place. We are so grateful for the sacrifices you make in your tithing to support the daily operation of our fantastic staff and our 60+ ministries. Your tithing is actively at work. Plus, you give so generously to the "Forward in Faith, Hope & Love Campaign" right now

for our driveways and parking lots, our special ministries (i.e. Helping Hands, Manna, PTO, Athletic Association and the Ladies Guild through the Craft Show next Saturday). Furthermore, our larger church, through Catholic Charities Annual Appeal and second collections for special causes, remind us all that "God loves a cheerful giver". We balance our own personal finances with those of our parish. I appreciate all you do for the parish and how you are helping us catch up in the first collection, your tithing to God to the parish's life. We had a rough winter – but God will help and guide us through these challenging times. Keep being the generous giving parishioner that you are! Keep up the great work that God does through you.

Courageous Conversations Sunday, April 7: Last fall we had a gathering of parishioners and Blessed Sacrament Community members to discuss the church's abuse crisis: to learn about some of the facts, share our emotions, have a place to vent and more. At that gathering, we promised to have a follow up after Pope Francis' February synod on the topic. The second conversation, then, a follow up, as well as a chance to talk more about this issue if you missed the first conversation, will be Sunday, April 7, 3:30 p.m. in Saint Ann Shrine. We are using this sacred space on our campus because of the influence of Saint Ann, the great protector of children and healer of all illness.

Other parishes across the diocese, along with Bishop Perez, are having these same conversations, for transparency, improving our church's life and assuring you that we as a church do follow our policies, that in our diocese, have been in place since the 1980's. We have a lay board that is our own team to assure that all staff and volunteers who work with young people and the vulnerable are up to standards.
