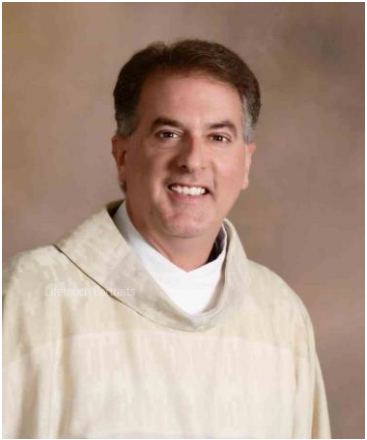

FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8TH PASTOR

4th Sunday in Lent:

I always enjoy hearing the story of the man born blind in the special Cycle A readings, used when there are adults preparing for baptism in a parish. This reading from the Gospel of John has been used since the fourth century as a way for us to reflect on the many ways in which we are called to sight. There is drama with the parents almost disowning their son for fear of the Jewish leaders. What do we have to be afraid of in our life that keeps us from true sight? Do we duck behind things in our life that keep us from truly believing or proclaiming the truth that needs to be seen? As usual, our Lenten readings give us much pause and time to reflect, and literally see the blind spots in our lives. Christ is calling us to wash away those elements and ready ourselves for renewed faith in the Easter Sprinkling Rite and Renewal of our Baptismal Promises. Let us make them mean something more!



Preparing for Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum: May I remind you of why we begin our Palm Sunday liturgy in the Eymard Room of the Family Life Center? It's the first option for this day - to have a proclamation of the special Gospel for the day, blessing of palms and a procession to the worship space. There are only three days of the liturgical year when the church invites us to remember our call to "take up our cross and follow the LORD" in a solemn procession. (The other days are February 2 and the Easter Vigil.) For some, I know it is difficult to walk. (And, having had to use a wheel chair and crutches for several of my accidents, I know the pain and challenge firsthand.) However, I always find it moving, no matter our ability or disability to see the church gather together, mindful that we are all processing - walking with Christ in our varied ways. We symbolically remind ourselves that we are walking to the new eternal Jerusalem, just as Christ walked for us to enter His holy city for His passion, death and resurrection. Christ transformed death so that we might live. We walk, no matter the burdens in our life, knowing that this Palm Sunday and Sacred Triduum will also transform us a bit more again!

Good Friday has many highlights that I enjoy. We begin at 9:00 a.m. with Morning Prayer in Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament Chapel. We hear psalms from the Bible, lamentations, that are only heard on this solemn day. They remind us of our loss, grief, mourning and transformation from our own suffering with Christ's suffering for us.

I also thoroughly appreciate how our young people truly get excited and involved with the living Stations of the Cross at **Noon**. "Mary Did You Know" always makes me cry as I see our youth sign this famous song, reminding us of the sorrowful mother and her place in the Paschal Mystery and the challenge of her faith. It's also so nice that Mama Rossi, out of the goodness of her heart, prepares a special soup lunch after these stations.

The last very moving highlight of the day for me is the Veneration of the Cross. I know many of you and your crosses! Seeing you come to adore the Holy Cross, walking with your own, and uniting your cross to Christ's is quite powerful for me. You remind me of your living witness of faith and your trust that we are Simon of Cyrene for one another, helping in our journeys of faith. **I hope you'll attend either the 3:00 p.m. or 7:30 p.m. service on Good Friday** to participate in these meaning events, and the special liturgy of the Passion of our LORD.

2020 Pastoral Planning Process: Another thing I am so proud of is our pastoral planning process that will initiate another plan for the next 5 years. Seven small groups are taking the previous/current plan, evaluating and coming up with new items for our next plan. Seeing folks gather in small groups, here at the church or at other café restaurants, Pastoral Council members surveying you our parishioners, and hearing the pride and care you have for our parish's life is amazingly edifying. Thank you for your prayers -- and continue to let us know what you would like to see our parish becoming in the next five years. Let's keep dreaming and implementing the dream with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Re-enrollment in our School: Let's also remember that we are the best advertisement for our parish, especially our award-winning school.
