FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8TH PASTOR



Easter Sunday of the LORD'S Resurrection: Happy Easter! And for those of you who are visiting, welcome to Saint Paschal Baylon! If you happen to be looking for a new parish home and new life in your Spirit, we hope you'll consider our faith community. On behalf of the Blessed Sacrament Community, the Pastoral Staff and the Sisters of Notre Dame, may the next 50 days of Easter truly be a time of "new life" for you. May the Holy Spirit bring in you a new growth that will give you a blessed hope, a stronger faith and so much love to share.

Over the years, I have published the list of our 60+ ministries in our Easter bulletin, as a way to remind you of the vibrant life of our parish and our hope you'll join in a new ministry, organization or opportunity to be of service. Due to space restrictions, I hope you'll look at the ministries found on our website or pray and think how you may serve one another in a new way that will definitely help you grow. I guarantee it!

Review of our Bulletin, Music Boards and Worship Guides: Speaking of our bulletin, how can we make it better in serving you? We have had several suggestions and comments about the bulletin, how we worship, announce songs, put the numbers up on the brown boards and more over the years. The Liturgy Commission, Pastoral Staff and Pastoral Council are currently studying what would be more helpful for you to engage in our worship life, reduce some printing costs and make it easier for you to participate. Please pray for this discernment period. Next week our Pastoral Council will analyze these issues at our meeting.

New Members for the Pastoral Council, School Advisory Council and Finance Council: Spring begins our discernment for three of our important advisory councils in the parish. We have the regular rotation of people joining councils to serve with me, Pastoral Staff members and the other members of the parish. Are you a person who likes to plan, implement plans, develop a vision? Pastoral Council is for you! Have a financial background? Finance Council! Want to continue the great, award-winning quality of our school? Contact me for the School Advisory Council. I would also like to throw in that if you would like to share your view "from the pew," we are always looking for members to join our Liturgy Commission, too. May I also strongly suggest that our youth and young adults consider sharing your gifts and talents with us. We are a parish that always wants to grow, especially as we work on our 2020, five-year Pastoral Plan. Help in the leadership of our parish!

Posture for Mass – Sing for Communion: Inserted in today's bulletin is a special letter from Bishop Perez continuing and affirming the posture for the Communion Rite. Back in 2001 and 2011, when the rubrics for the Mass changed, most parishes in the diocese of Cleveland were able to implement and follow the general rules for the Communion Rite: Stand and Sing in reverence to the Body of Christ. While our parish has followed the posture, we are still working on the "singing aspect." **PLEASE SING DURING COMMUNION!** Just as we sing, "Happy Birthday," or the "National Anthem," giving our voice back, so should we for this very important part of the Mass. How could we not sing when we are in communion? After the song is over, then we pray with our LORD silently, but meanwhile, we sing and pray with the words of the communion song – powerful words that are a special prayer chosen for us to sing.

May I also remind those who have been kneeling for the Eucharistic Prayer, that as the bishop says in his pastoral letter, and in the handouts we will read over the coming weeks, we stand together (for those who are physically able) and observe this form of reverence, just as we do for the Gospel! I am often surprised that people who kneel for parts of the service, say that this is what they were taught about reverence when they were young. Yet, they do not “kneel” for the Gospel, which is the high point of the Liturgy of the Word. (I’m not advocating kneeling for the Gospel – just pointing out an idiosyncrasy!) Let’s model our unity and prayer, for those who are able, by standing, participating in this reverent posture and especially singing the Communion Song.

Annual Easter Egg Hunt: We thank the SPB Families Group for leading the Easter Egg Hunt after the 10:00 a.m. Mass, **Sunday, April 28 in the cross alley, weather permitting!**

Enjoying the New Organ: What a blessing to have the Olsin Organ, a gift from the estate of Beverly Olsin and the Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland. We will have a special blessing, rededication of the instrument and mini concert on **Sunday, June 2 at 3:00 p.m.** We will honor the families who gave the organ to the Ursuline Sisters and Scott Olsin, Beverly’s son. Also note that the old organ is going for parts to the company that installed the instrument for us. The area where the old organ has been will be cemented over this week, giving us some extra space by the altar server bench.

Preparing for Spring Fling X Parish Festival: We have some great new food offerings coming this year and special new LIVE entertainment, including the Cleveland Bluegrass Orchestra. Thank you for selling raffle tickets and getting the word out; we appreciate the families that have taken additional tickets too! **I know May 16 – 19 is on your calendar for being with us these special days!**

National Day of Prayer Celebration: What can we do as a nation to be better? Pray together! We know the old axiom: The family that prays together stays together. May we as neighbors and friends do the same to continue to strengthen our neighborhood by joining in a special one-hour service at Lyndhurst Community Presbyterian Church (across from Lyndhurst Municipal Complex), **Thursday, May 2, 7:00 p.m.** The Hillcrest Ministerial Association hosts this annual gathering as a witness to the religions of our community gathering and praying as one for the good of our community and nation.

Eymard Spiritual Group: In 1980, when Father Jette was pastor (1979 – 1985), he organized a midday group that would gather once a month for a potluck luncheon and have a time of spiritual, intellectual and educational formation. He wanted it to be under the patronage of the SSS founder, Saint Peter Julian Eymard. Since then, for 39 years, we have been blessed with great food, fun and reflection to enhance our parish’s life. We even had this group meet in the evening a few times just to have more participate in the great talks.

Children's Liturgy of the Word at 2 Masses Starting June 1:

Beginning on June 1, we will celebrate the Children's Liturgy of the Word at the 4:30 p.m. Mass (in addition to Sundays at the 10:00 a.m. Mass). For those unfamiliar with this celebration, here's how it goes:

- In the opening procession of the Mass, a child carries the candle and another child carries the *Lectionary for Masses with Children*, an approved liturgical translation to form young Catholic Christians. (It's the Sunday readings at their level.)
- After the Collect (Opening Prayer), the children are called up into the sanctuary and from the altar process to the Eymard Room.
- During their time in the Eymard Room (and parents, grandparents and other family members are welcome to also attend and walk over with the children), the children have an adult leader who helps them hear the scriptures, reflect on God's Word and complete an activity that brings out the theme or meaning of the readings for that Sunday.
- During the Preparation of the Gifts, the children and family members return to the church for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Tricia Slemc has organized this for 9 wonderful years at the 10:00 a.m. Mass. Even though her children have not been part of the "dismissal" and CLW for the last 2 years, she's continued to organize this ministry for us. We are so grateful and are so happy she will continue to assist as a catechist-leader and substitute. We have wonderful catechist leaders who assist at 10:00 a.m. Mass and now expanding this ministry this summer to assist families who attend either Mass. Spread the word - and contact George Peko (our Catechetical Leader at psr@saintpaschal.com) if you would like to be part of the team that leads this ministry.

Procession with the Blessed Sacrament: Annually we have a special homilist celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ at our weekend Masses - this year, June 22/23. After the Noon Mass, we keep the custom of a procession with the Blessed Sacrament with our parish ministry leaders, First Communicants and our guest preacher helping us lead the procession. We are honored to have Blessed Sacrament Father Tom Smithson up from our SSS Houston parish for this celebration.
