FROM FATHER LANE, SSS, OUR 8TH PASTOR



2nd Sunday of Easter: “Peace be with you!” This greeting in today’s Gospel and a few times elsewhere in sacred Scripture is a reminder of the great greeting that Christ, angels of God and each of us say to one another during each Mass. “Peace be with you!” Is it a command? Is it a hope? Is it a way of life? These are the questions that beckon us as we hear Christ say them again and we hear the priest speak them during the Mass. Our world needs more peace: first in ourselves, then in those around us. Like loving, it is contagious when we practice this special gift and share it. Sadly, I hear too often at wakes, “S/he looks so peaceful!” Were they when

they were alive? May we not wait until we are “viewed,” but see us now sharing this gift of the Holy Spirit, a gift that should be kept on giving.

Posture for Mass – Sing for Communion: We pray for peace in about 20% of the parishes in the diocese of Cleveland, for there are folks who are not happy that they must implement a rubric for Mass that has been called for since 1970. Depending upon when parishes implemented the 1970, 2001 or 2011 instructions for Mass (there were revisions along the way), a parish implemented the universal norm to stand during the entire Communion Rite, while **singing the Communion Song** (Antiphon). For some this was a strange rubric, but we were instructed to do this since we started receiving Holy Communion in 1970, with the revised Mass. Those who are older may recall a time of kneeling, and rarely receiving Holy Communion. The rubrics for Mass were only for the priest – and in the 1970 General Instruction of the Roman Missal, for the first time, there were rubrics to guide the congregation. We stand in reverence for the high points of the Mass. Just as when we stand to sing the National Anthem, the Communion Song, which we are all called to sing, is the high point of **living and being in communion with one another!** Like the Gospel of the Liturgy of the Word, reception of Holy Communion together is a special act of the Body of Christ, with and for the Body of Christ. Before Vatican II, the congregation knelt for the whole Mass while the priest “said his Mass” privately in front of the people. Obviously, the theology and way we celebrate Eucharist returned to the original notion that we hear in the Sacred Scriptures these past days of the Sacred Triduum.

Bishop Perez noticed some parishes were not complying with the rubrics for the Mass. In order for more uniformity of posture in our diocese, he asked that this Sunday be the day that we all follow the universal posture of standing while taking, receiving and waiting for all to receive Holy Communion. We reverence Christ and one another in this action. That’s why we sing – it’s that special!

Enjoying the New Organ: What a blessing to have the Olsin Organ, a gift from the estate of Beverly Olsin and the Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland. We will have a special blessing, rededication of the instrument and mini concert on **Sunday, June 3 at 3:00 p.m.** We will honor the families who gave the organ to the Ursuline Sisters and Scott Olsin, Beverly’s son. Also note that the old organ is going for parts to the company that installed the instrument for us. The area where the old organ has been will be cemented over this week, giving us some extra space by the altar server bench.

Preparing for Spring Fling X Parish Festival: We have some great new food offerings coming this year, special new LIVE entertainment, including the Cleveland Bluegrass Orchestra. Thank you for selling raffle tickets and getting the word out; we appreciate the families that have taken additional tickets too! **I know May 16 – 19 is on your calendar for being with us these special days!**

National Day of Prayer Celebration: What can we do as a nation to be better? Pray together, especially for peace. We know the old axiom: The family that prays together stays together. May we, as neighbors and friends, do the same to continue to strengthen our neighborhood by joining in a special night (a one-hour service) at Lyndhurst Community Presbyterian Church (across from Lyndhurst Municipal Complex), **Thursday, May 2, 7:00 p.m.** The Hillcrest Ministerial Association hosts this annual gathering as a witness to the religions of our community gathering and praying as one for the good of our community and nation. One community at a time we build our future!

Procession with the Blessed Sacrament: Annually, we have a special homilist celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ at our weekend Masses – this year, June 22/23. After the Noon Mass, we keep the custom of a procession with the Blessed Sacrament with our parish ministry leaders, First Communicants and our guest preacher.
