3rd Sunday of Easter: Today we hear again the “First Breakfast” of the Risen LORD. What a way for the disciples to start a day! Here they were in despair for the poor catch, and then the realization that they had forgotten the special greeting, ministry and the Risen LORD’s appearance in their life. We can’t point fingers and accuse them of knowing better for in our morning routine, do we sometimes act cranky and not see the Risen LORD in our lives? What a great reminder for us to practice a routine of morning prayers, asking God to make sure we are the Risen LORD to others with our presence of love. Then we will be filled with

the good stuff: not fish and bread, but the warmth of Christ’s presence.

First Communion: What a joy to celebrate 90 First Communions this weekend at the Noon Mass. We pray that our children and their parents will remain fervent in their faith and continue to receive Communion as often as possible.
