4th Sunday of Easter: Happy Mother's Day and Good Shepherd Sunday! Many years, both of these feast days occur at the same time in our country. This is a great blessing for us because as we know, our mothers and grandmothers are the "chief shepherds" for many of our families. That is, without our mothers and grandmothers, our faith and special care as a disciple of Christ would not be passed along in a wonderful and profound example of Christ's shepherding ways.

Also, in this very short passage from John's Gospel, we hear the important call and the challenge to always listen to God's voice.

When we listen carefully, we hear our vocation (which is why the church globally celebrates this day as World Day for Vocations). We are called to listen carefully, and we will "never perish," never fall from eternal life.

I am extremely grateful to our Vocation Committee for inviting Sr. Erin to speak at our Masses this weekend on her vocation. This is our annual time to listen to an inspiring woman religious with a special reflection on her call. Leading our candidates for initiation, we thank George Peko our Catechetical Leader and Chris Hart, his assistant, for all their hard work. The other liturgical ministers, from lighting with the Platkos, incredible art & environment under the leadership and hard work of Jeffrey Loerch and Fr. John, and our great lectors, communion ministers, altar servers and ushers, and chief sacristan George Zagar with porter Jimmy – we are blessed with great women and men who dedicate themselves so well to insure we have wonderful worship here in our parish. I am surrounded by angels! And a parishioner base of wonderful people who love to praise God and remember. THANK YOU for your worship dedication to SPB during Holy Week and through this great 50 Days of Easter!

More on Posture and Singing at Communion Before Vatican 2 & Now: As some churches in our diocese join the universal church in adhering to the posture rubric in the global church, that is to stand during the entire Communion Rite while we sing and all receive, we review a bit where folks got their previous “cultural disposition.” Interestingly, the posture for the congregation was not regulated before 1970. Sadly, the liturgical rubrics only focus on the clergy from 1570 – 1970. This is why there are such variations across the globe, but especially from parish to parish. Pastors and religious education teachers (yes, some wonderful sisters!) told their congregations what they should do so that they were not distracting during the Mass. Many prayed rosaries silently and knelt while the priest “said” “his” Mass. The congregation watched the priest “perform” the Mass. Many teachers said, “behave,” by being quiet, and the 20th century prayer books helped participants “read” the prayers of the Mass or other devotionals. Prayers such as the “Divine Praises” came in to fashion, especially after a “high Mass” that was at the end of the morning Mass routine, concluding with benediction with the Blessed Sacrament.

After the Second Vatican Council, history, theology and pastoral practices returned to former centuries when all the people participated in the liturgy. Therefore, even to this day, there is a class in ideologies; some still feel “quiet, pray alone with God.” Clearly, however, the new order of Mass, in 1970, returned to a participatory liturgy where especially at certain points of the liturgy called for the congregation to participate. Some like to pick and choose what “they like.” But could you image no Universal Prayers? (“Lord hear our prayer.”) Not reciting the Creed? No Sign of Peace? Not receiving Holy Communion? Especially not being offered the Precious Blood? These are all elements that were not part of the 1570 liturgy that were restored with the 1970 Mass. Not only that, a shift happened with the communion rite as I’ll demonstrate below:

	1570 Mass	1970 Mass
Lord’s Prayer	Priest Only	All
Sign of Peace	None	All (2001 update– priest doesn’t leave sanctuary)
Communion	Priest; those in good standing may approach and kneel at rail	All (Body and Blood offered) Stand until the entire congregation receives in respect to Christ and the Body of Christ (us!)
Song	By choir, if present	All
Silence	Most of the time	After all have received; meditation and personal prayer follows (sit or kneel)
Concluding Rites	Most left once the priest finished	Yes; we leave after blessing and the procession concludes

What a blessing to have the Olsin Organ, a gift from the estate of Beverly Olsin. This is the organ that was at the Ursuline Sisters of Cleveland mother house chapel in Pepper Pike. We will have a special blessing, rededication of the instrument and mini concert on **Sunday, June 2 at 3:00 p.m.** We will honor the families who gave the organ to the Ursuline Sisters and Scott Olsin, Beverly’s son.

Procession with the Blessed Sacrament: Fr Tom Smithson, SSS and I will “switch” the weekend of June 23/23 to celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ in our parishes here and in Houston, Texas. Annually, we have a special homilist celebrate this solemnity at our weekend Masses. Remember that after the Noon Mass, we keep the custom of a procession with the Blessed Sacrament, with our parish ministry leaders and First Communicants. Plan on attending and rounding out this special time of spiritual renewal in your life.

Forward in Faith, Hope & Love Campaign for Our Parking Lot & Driveway Improvements:

- Needed Goal: **\$1,000,000.00** (a million dollars!)
- Initial Cash in hand: **\$289,000.00** (as of April 30)
 - Minus \$75,600 for phase one - in worst condition: SSS Kitchen Lot
 - Minus \$138,717.60 for phase two - the second worst condition: Horseshoe Lot
 - Left on hand for the next phase: \$41,682.40 (Need about \$70,000 more for Phase 4)
 - Let's work on Phase 4 (Blue Ribbon Way) next!
- **Phase 1 - Saint Paschal Lane – Summer of 2017** – Completed with a loan from bank at \$249,000. We still have \$111,648.39 left on this loan – and in part – the capital campaign, by request of Bishop Perez and the Finance Council of the diocese, asks us to eliminate this debt before any more building campaigns. We are one of the few parishes in the diocese that has **no** savings. (Parish organizations have their funds in savings – the parish is challenged while the ministries and organizations are doing very well.) Loans will be paid off after all the other lots are completed.
- **Phase 2 –SSS Kitchen Lot** - This was \$75,600 for this portion that will support all the trucks, deliveries and our Helping Hands Ministry that works out of our SSS Kitchen each Wednesday and Saturday. Completed!
- **Phase 3 – The Horseshoe Parking Lot on Wilson Mills:** This phase is nearly completed.
- **Phase 4 – Blue Ribbon Way:** This special driveway by the school will also be cement to support the large amounts of traffic, heavy buses and more. **PLEASE GIVE TO THE CAMPAIGN TODAY!! We appreciate the special effort by the School Parents – who know the value and need of this area.**
- **Phase 5 & 6: West (part 5 - closer to Fr Jette Gym) and East (part 6) Lots**
