The Pastoral Council met on Monday, April 29, 2019.

- An update on parking lot was presented. \$287K has been raised which is 1/3 of the goal. Second Project: Blessed Sacrament Parking Lot. Third Project: Horseshoe which will have two sections of parking on both sides. Fourth Project: Blue Ribbon Way. A temporary patch will be made as we continue to raise necessary funds.
- Next, we had an update on Pastoral Plan 2020 .
- Members whose terms will terminate include Mark Geyman, Michelle Kitko (new teacher rep needed), Molly Kane and Rosalie Lewis.
- Spring Fling Flyer was distributed to elicit volunteers to work at the Food Tent. Parishioners can sign up online on the website. Booklet has raised \$22,000. This is a great improvement! Raffle sale \$24K which is ahead of last year.
- Council discussed bulletin and worship Guide suggestions and ideas. These will be presented to the Liturgy Commission

5th Sunday of Easter: Happy Saint Paschal Baylon days! Our beloved patron saint's feast day is May 17 and we love celebrating our great saint with this parish festival around his day. After all, he is the patron of chefs, cooks, Eucharistic congresses – and our great parish is all of that because of him and you! You share your beloved gifts of time, talent, treasure and lots of volunteering in the kitchen, to make sure we have great feasts and festivals here at SPB. Thank you for living up to our patron and knowing that we are blessed by his great inspiration and care!

Easter Joy! Meanwhile, our Sunday readings remind us of the great gift of strengthening our love for one another. The First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles states that Paul and Barnabas went around strengthening the communities in different places, encouraging them to love and share their gifts and talents. The Gospel today traces the final discourse of Jesus in John's narrative and after the foot washing and Judas' leaving the supper, we are given a new commandment: love one another. Parish festivals, parish ministries and the joy of people gathering together to share their time, talents and gifts are a joyous ways of living this commandment of love. May God bless you for your efforts to be true to this loving. Thank you for sharing this gift when you worship or give service to the parish's life.

Thanks to Spring Fling X Committee: Every year our festival gets bigger and better! We are blessed with a dynamic team of leadership with Bob Mastrangelo, Kelly Ericsson, Kathy Pohlhammer and Michelle Mazza. Special thanks also go to our Maintenance Team, Jon, George, Mario, Vince, Scott, Labeeb and Jeff who make sure everything runs so smoothly behind these scenes. If this is before 5:30 p.m. on Sunday, and you are reading this, you still have time to get in on the raffle. Thanks for your support of this raffle and the program booklet: these items insure a successful fundraiser (and as Bob likes to say) makes sure we have insurance in case it rains. Funds for Spring Fling go to the general operation of our parish's 3.2 million budget – that includes the school and the other parish ministries. It all makes us a stronger financial institution, since our parish has no savings and always has invested in the facilities to make them a better place for all to enjoy.

Forward in Faith, Hope & Love Campaign: We are enjoying the 29% success of our campaign so far and three of our projects completed. At this point in our capital campaign we are making a special push for Blue Ribbon Way, phase 4, our next driveway project. We are asking our school families to make a special donation. Since it is not reflected in your tuition, all maintenance and capital improvements come through your tithing and special fundraising so that they are tax deductible for you. As a parish school, this is how we support our facility and our large commitment to having a parish Catholic school.

Many institutions have high tuition to pay for their buildings: we choose not to do this, in order, to make tuition more affordable and ask families to be as generous as they are able. I know many families struggle and still share what they are able; your sacrifice is such a powerful witness. However, we are making this appeal for our school families to make their commitment over the summer to help us complete work on Blue Ribbon Way, Thanks for your continued sacrifices for your children – and for your parish family!

More on Posture & Singing at Communion Before Vatican 2 & Now: Last week a number of folks appreciated the history of posture and music in the liturgy. Here I repeat, especially for our visitors. Bishop Perez wrote recently too, “When in Rome, do as the Romans do” which is a sign of hospitality and care. Wherever we go, we observe the posture of the parish, diocese, knowing that there are some variations. But back to the history:

Sadly, the liturgical rubrics only focus on the clergy from 1570 – 1970. This is why there are such variations across the globe, but especially from parish to parish. Pastors and religious education teachers told their congregations what they should do so that they were not distracting during the Mass. Many prayed rosaries silently and knelt while the priest “said” “his” Mass. The congregation was spectators, watching the priest. Many teachers said, “behave,” by being quiet, and the 20th century prayer books helped participants “read” the prayers of the Mass or other devotionals. Prayers such as the “Divine Praises” came into fashion, especially after a “high Mass” that was at the end of the morning Mass routine, concluding with benediction with the Blessed Sacrament.

After the Second Vatican Council, history, theology and pastoral practices returned to former centuries when all the people participated in the liturgy. This is why, even to this day, there is such a class in ideologies; some still feel “quiet, pray, alone with God.” Clearly, however, the new order of Mass, in 1970, returned to a participatory liturgy which, especially at certain points of the liturgy, called for the congregation to participate. Could you imagine no Universal Prayers? (“Lord hear our prayer.”) Not reciting the Creed? No Sign of Peace? Not receiving Holy Communion? These are all elements that were not part of the 1570 liturgy that were restored with the 1970 Mass. Not only that, a shift happened with the communion rite as I’ll demonstrate with these two columns:

Lord’s Prayer	Priest Only	All
Sign of Peace	None	All (2001 update - (Priest doesn’t leave sanctuary)
Communion	Priest; those in good standing may approach and kneel at rail	All (Body & Blood offered) Stand until the entire congregation receives in respect to Christ & the Body of Christ (us!)
Song	By choir, if present	All
Silence	Most of the time	After all have received; meditation and personal prayer follows (sit or kneel)
Concluding Rites	Most left once the priest finished	Yes; we leave <u>after</u> blessing and the procession concludes

Procession with the Blessed Sacrament: Blessed Sacrament Fr Tom Smithson and I will “switch” the weekend of June 23/23 to celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ in our parishes here and Houston, Texas. Annually we have a special homilist celebrate this solemnity at our weekend Masses. Remember that after the Noon Mass, we keep the custom of a procession with the Blessed Sacrament with our parish ministry leaders and First Communicants. Plan on attending and rounding out this special time of spiritual renewal in your life. **The procession will be at the Noon Mass.**

Questions About the Parish? About the Faith? Come to the parish deck for our annual time to learn about the heritage of our parish or church's history. We will gather on the deck, that is located in the "Cross Alley," the area off the Horseshoe Parking Lot, on the way to the church, between the school and the parish office in that grassy area. You may enter through the parish offices or just come outside and walk up the alley toward the large cross. You'll see the deck next to the pastor's office. We will gather for about an hour, **Wednesday, May 29, 6:30 p.m.**

Want to Become Catholic? Have a conversation with one of the priests or with our Catechetical Leader, George Peko to begin the process.

Let us continue to pray for each other and for our confirmandi who will be confirmed next Sunday at 3:00 p.m. We pray that the Holy Spirit keeps our fine young people active and engaged in our church and world, sharing the gifts of the Holy Spirit.

- Needed Goal: \$1,000,000.00 (a million dollars!)
- Initial Cash in hand: \$289,000.00 (as of April 30)
 - Minus \$75,600 for phase two -SSS Kitchen Lot
 - Minus \$138,717.60 for phase three - Horseshoe Lot
 - Left on hand for the next phase: \$41,682.40 (Need about \$60,000 more for Phase 4)
 - Let's work on Phase 4 (Blue Ribbon Way)
- **Phase 1 - Saint Paschal Lane – Summer of 2017** – Completed with a loan from bank at \$249,000. We still have \$111,648.39 left on this loan – and in part – the capital campaign, by request of Bishop Perez and the Finance Council of the diocese, asks us to eliminate this debt before any more building campaigns. We are one of the few parishes in the diocese that has no savings. (Parish organizations have their funds in savings – the parish is challenged while the ministries and organizations are doing very well.) Loans will be paid off after all the other lots are completed.

- **Phase 2 –SSS Kitchen Lot** - This was \$75,600 for this portion that will support all the trucks, deliveries and our Helping Hands Ministry that works out of our SSS Kitchen each Wednesday and Saturday. Completed!
- **Phase 3 – The Horseshoe Parking Lot on Wilson Mills:** Completed!
- **Phase 4 – Blue Ribbon Way:** This special driveway by the school will also be cement to support the large amounts of traffic, heavy buses and more. **PLEASE GIVE TO THE CAMPAIGN TODAY!! We appreciate the special effort by the School Parents – who know the value and need of this area.**
- **Phase 5 & 6: West (part 5 - closer to Fr Jette Gym) and East (part 6) Lots**
