6th Sunday of Easter: Easter Time is rapidly moving along this year! We continue to hear from Christ's "Final Discourse" to the disciples at the Last Supper. The context and setting are so important because this is the great time of Jesus' last teachings to his disciples. His action of washing feet, his sharing his Body and Blood, the betrayal and the discourse all are in a context of reminding us that our acts of service help us grow in love and develop a sense of peace and surety in our lives. And when we get anxious or worried again, we have these words that echo in our head from Christ: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you." We are encouraged to trust in the Holy Spirit again and trust in the peace that will ease tattered hearts and help us feel no trouble or fear.

Memorial Day Greetings: This is our special weekend to begin the summer months in NE Ohio. We appreciate that you have your "first meal/breakfast" here with us before you begin your weekend activities. We remember those who have served our country and pray for their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed. We will never forget them! Thanks too, for never forgetting your parish! We appreciate how parishioners mail in their envelope or have signed up for "e-offering" to ensure that their gift to God is always here with us while you are away, but present in spirit.

Congratulations Confirmandi! We welcome special visitors who are here for the sacrament of Confirmation. We hope you enjoy your time here this weekend and are grateful for your support of our eighth graders and one adult who are receiving the sacrament today. We are also grateful to Bishop Martin Amos, making his first celebration here with us at SPB as bishop, returning to his home diocese after serving as bishop of Davenport, Iowa for many years.

Flag Day is Coming! Traditionally, our Scouts have a service project of taking our old tattered flags and giving them the proper respect in decommissioning them. Please return your old "old glories" to the Fickel Narthex by June 14. The Scouts will take care of the rest!

100K for Blue Ribbon Way! – 58K to go!!! We have a special challenge – especially for our school families, since we have only had 6 school families donate to the capital campaign for the parking lots and driveways: Let's have all our school families make their pledge/payment now during the month of June so that we are able to complete Blue Ribbon Way (the drive next to the school) **before the next school year begins in August!** We do not tack on a maintenance fee on to our tuition like some schools do. This is a way we keep our tuition more reasonable and ask for families to give what is within their means and sacrifices. That's why all capital projects, such as the roof, windows and now driveways and parking lots are part of our sacrificial building plan to keep our campus up to the latest technology (PTO fundraisers), safe (grants for cameras and security features), and even safer by having driveways and parking lots that are accessible, free from danger and harm. **58K for Blue Ribbon Way! We can do this! Let's raise this in June as we sacrifice from something for our own family and give to our parish family!**

Next Sunday - Blessing of the Organ & Rededication: We will have a special blessing, rededication of the instrument and mini concert on **Sunday, June 2 at 3:00 p.m.** We will honor the families who gave the organ to the Ursuline Sisters and Scott Olsin, who gave it to us when the Ursulines downsized and needed a new home for this beautiful instrument.

Procession with the Blessed Sacrament: Blessed Sacrament Fr Tom Smithson and I will “switch” the weekend of June 23/23 to celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ in our parishes here and Houston, Texas. Annually, we have a special homilist celebrate this solemnity at our weekend Masses. Remember that after the Noon Mass, we keep the custom of a procession with the Blessed Sacrament with our parish ministry leaders and First Communicants. Plan on attending and rounding out this special time of spiritual renewal in your life. **The procession will be at the Noon Mass.**
