We have seen what Jesus did in today’s gospel and why he did it. I think it is significant also to see how he did it. Jesus surely did not get up in the morning and say: “what would you like to do today, guys?” We may be sure that he had an agenda that flowed from his ongoing prayer. Today’s lesson about healing shows his flexibility. Sometimes reacting is more needed than acting. Having children reminds many of you of that. This gospel reminds us all of Jesus’ flexibility and teaches us that to “live Jesus” includes “hanging loose,” maintaining a flexibility to the important needs of others.

The Mass is scheduled for **Thursday, July 12, 2018 at 7:00 PM, in the Diocesan Pastoral Center, 330 Wyoming Avenue, Scranton**. All persons who have lost a loved one through tragic and traumatic death are invited to this liturgy. We ask that the names of deceased loved ones are registered on registration forms which are available in the parish office or accessed on the Service and Social Concerns webpage on the Diocese of Scranton's website, [www.dioceseofscranton.org](http://www.dioceseofscranton.org). 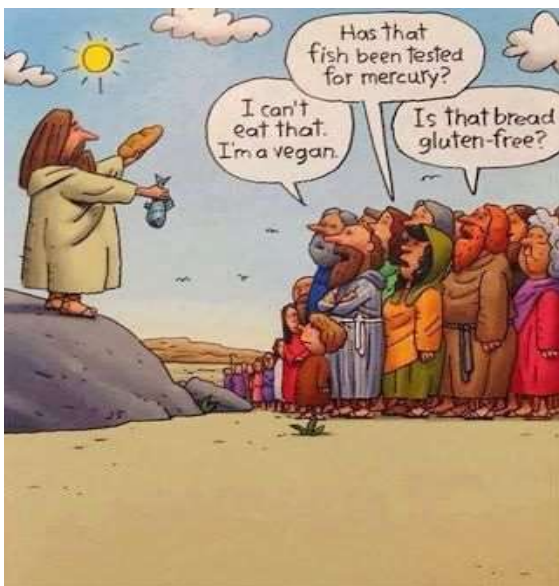

## Pastoral Council Meeting Minutes – June 21, 2018

Members attending: Fr. Jacek, Marina Kopko, Marsha Sipper, Rosemary Coates, Maureen Dillon, Kathy Narcum, Ed Weihbrecht, Ed Bozek, Mike Young, Helen Nowak Gabriel

Meeting began with opening prayer

Previous meeting minutes were printed in 5/27/18 bulletin

Faith Sharing – Ed B shared a special spiritual time in his life

Pastor report – still looking for new truck to be purchased for the cemeteries; various repairs made on property

### Committee Reports:

Community – Coffee and Doughnuts the weekend of June 2 & 3 hosted by parishioners was successful; next one will be Sept. 15 & 16; new volunteer to be trained for Welcoming Committee—7 new members to welcome during summer

Social Concerns – current focus is on the school supply program; donations slow to date

Word – Vacation Bible School had to be cancelled; Faith Formation looking for new teachers; new program being planned for children on First Fridays; we average 7-8 baptisms yearly; discussion of Steubenville and Light the Fire programs for youth

Worship – winding down after Easter season; report from last meeting provided from bulletin minutes

Pastoral Plan update: Parish Directory – dates have been set for pictures to be taken the end of July and beginning of August; free directory and portrait to be provided to participants; new announcements coming; reminder phone calls started to parishioners

### Old Business:

Report on 5/31/18 safety presentation steering committee meeting – attendees were Fr. Jacek, Al Walker, Jim Kolojechick, John Sipper, Bob Burns, Marina Kopko. Committee discussed steps to take to prepare to educate parishioners on what to do in potential safety emergencies. First steps suggested were: purchase AED defibrillator machine and general medical emergency kits to have available; invite all ushers and sextons to attend the safety presentation given to the Pastoral Council in Dec.; schedule an additional presentation for any interested parishioners so they would know what to do if the need arises; schedule additional informational safety programs for parishioners

### New Business:

Review and discuss Stewardship pilot program invitation – the Diocese needs completed paperwork on our Pastoral Council and Pastoral Planning by Sept. 30, 2018 so that will be added to our September agenda; a volunteer from our Council is needed for a 4-month pilot program on Stewardship to be given Aug. – Nov. 2018.

Members asked to review Council binders over summer to see if changes need to be made.

There was a suggestion to have an art exhibit of parishioners' sacred art and share the history of the art in our church.
