

FROM THE PASTOR.....

Part of the traditional religious experience of November is writing down the names of our dearly departed, those family and friends of ours who have passed away into our Book of the Dead which is always placed in front of the altar, so that at every Mass in November, those souls will be remembered. Placing the names of our departed loved ones into the Book of the Dead is both a reassuring and a somewhat discomfiting task. The very act of writing down the names of our beloved dead reminds us both of the finality of it all, that we will also one day die, but it also reminds us of the promise it holds. Where our blessed loved ones have gone, one day we will follow. Some day someone will stand at our graves; someday someone will write our names in their list of the November dead. Fr. John O'Donohue, the priest-writer-philosopher who recently died, wrote shortly before his death about the need for us to 'befriend death.' It seems a strange, almost morbid thought but for Fr. O'Donohue it was a natural extension of living. From the moment we are born, he wrote, death walks beside us and we need to befriend it so that 'you will have no need to fear when your time comes to leave'. His point was that an awareness of the presence of death calls our life, as it were, to attention and helps us to 'live the life you would love to look back on from your death-bed'. So in this November let us faithfully remember our dead. For all of us this November, the leaves of time will be swept away as the colder winds sweep away the summer leaves, but memory, especially memory inspired by the Holy Spirit, keeps those summer memories alive. Let us remember, lest we forget.

in union with the Masses said
throughout the world today,
for all the Holy Souls in Purgatory,
for sinners everywhere,
for sinners in the universal Church,
for those in my own home,
and in my family. Amen.”**

CULTURE OF LIFE



We pray that God may also forgive those who participate in the act of abortion and for all sexual abuses against children. Submitted by Charles Griego (Knight of Columbus)




EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION






ABUSE AWARENESS TRAINING FOR ADULTS

In order to create a safe environment in the workplace, neighborhood, home and church and to acquaint Archdiocesan personnel with policies and reporting procedures, the Archdiocese provides Abuse Awareness Training for Adults on an ongoing basis. Attendance at the training is mandatory for all adults, over the age of 18 who volunteer in any ministry, in any parish within the Archdiocese of Santa Fe. Pre-registration is necessary. Note: Do not bring children. No one under the age of 18 is allowed in the workshop. If you are late you will not be allowed to enter the training.
