FROM THE PASTOR.....

What does it mean when our Lord Jesus says in this weekend's Gospel that he has come to bring "glad tidings to the poor?" "Glad tidings" is the Gospel, it's the good news that the Kingdom of God has come to us. But why to "the poor?" Because the poor are the people of God, the faithful ones, and they are to receive this "good news." And what is this good news? It means that God Himself will come and He will show us that it is in our poverty that we will understand. Ok, understand what? The true meaning of being poor. To be poor in spirit simply means that we know that we have a very strong need for God, we can't do this thing called life on our own. You see, it's not a matter of who has money and who doesn't; it's not a matter of who is rich and who is poor economically. There is an old story of a young man and his bride on their honeymoon and there they are a cruise looking out over the sea one night. The young groom says to his bride, with a bit of sadness for he knew that they were starting out without a lot of money, "Someday we're going to be rich." His bride looks at him and with a tone of correction that only a wife can bring, she says, "We're already rich! Someday we might get some money." This is very important to understand, because money and poverty have nothing to do with each other in the Gospel. We are rich when we are filled with the joy and the happiness of a life lived with, in, and through our Lord Jesus Christ, when we are living a life after fully receiving those "glad tidings."
