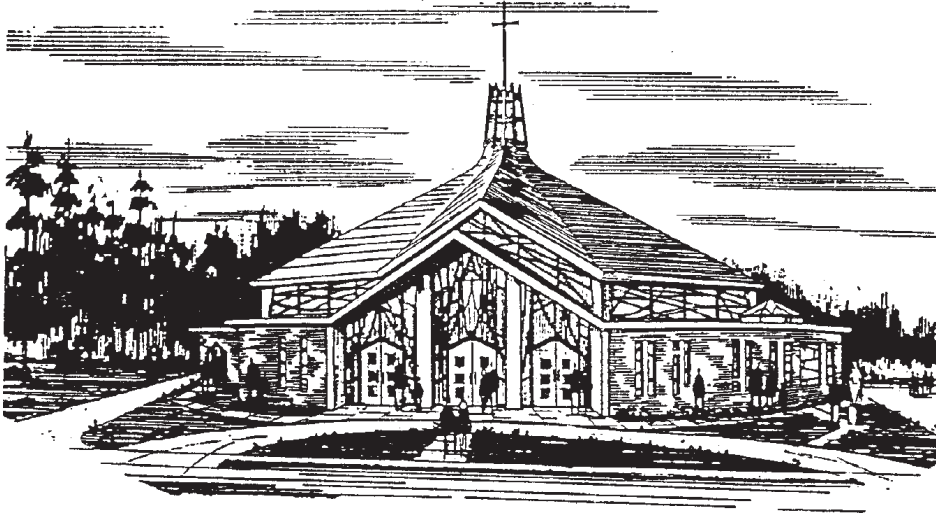

Message from the Pastor:

“In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.”

No other Christian faith starts and ends every single prayer with the Sign of the Cross! Today, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, the Scriptures call for reflection on this central belief of Christianity: the Trinity. One of the greatest gifts of the Christian faith is the dogma of the triune God: God is three (tri) in one (une). The Trinity is not just a dogma but an indwelling presence of three Persons who continually create, save, and sustain us and all of creation.

In today’s Gospel, Jesus approached the eleven disciples and said “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit....” Jesus has passed on to us His power to gather all human beings into the loving embrace of the Trinity. Because of baptism, our triune God dwells within each of us, enabling us to embody God’s presence among the “nations.” We are the visible sign of Jesus’ promise: “I am with you always” and are called to this same mission as we share our faith in Him!

This week we return to Ordinary Time. While Ordinary Time may suggest something usual or customary, this liturgical time is significant for our continued growth in faith, both as individuals who continue to be transformed by our observance of the liturgical year, and as a community that seeks to conform to the light, life and love revealed to us by Jesus. Ordinary Time, which takes us through the summer and fall, comprised of thirty or so weeks in which no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ itself is honored in its fullness. In addition to major Solemnities such as the Most Holy Trinity today, Corpus Christi next Sunday, Christ the King in November; feasts of the Transfiguration of the Lord in August and the Exaltation of the Cross in September, we will celebrate and honor Mary in the Solemnity of the Assumption in August. These observances, along with feast days of individual saints throughout, nurture our own desire to live as faithful Christians and as active participants in the Church.

Lastly, let us not forget the month of June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. “Behold the heart that has loved people so, yet is loved so little in return.” (St. Mary Margaret Alacoque). Why not try to spend some time getting to know Jesus a little closer to kick off your summer this next First Friday at the noon Mass and Holy Hour immediately following?

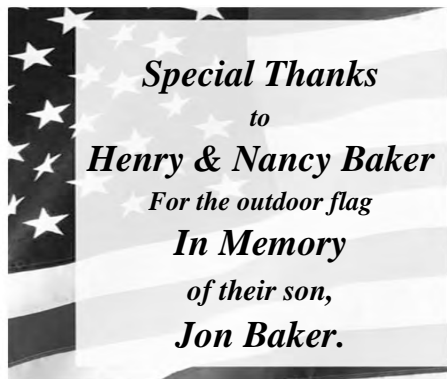
