

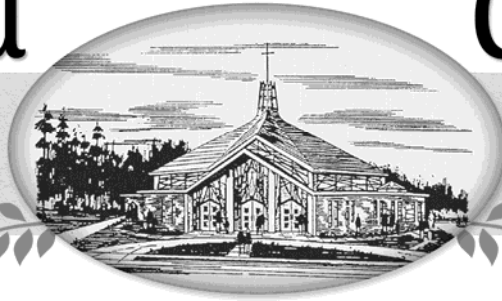

Message from the Pastor:

**This weekend begins an exciting time for our Parish –
the year-long Jubilee Celebration of our**

100th ANNIVERSARY!

I am filled with great joy and thankful to God that I am here with all the families of our Parish to share this extraordinary milestone in our Church. We will begin our celebration today at the noon Mass, with Bishop John W. Flesey presiding, giving thanks and praise to God for the humble beginnings of our Parish - from the spiritual richness and cultural traditions of those first Polish and Eastern Europeans immigrants in the Mahwah area to its evolution into the broad multi-ethnic Parish we are today. The motto “To Jesus through Mary” is as vibrant today as it was to those who first heard it in the tiny little Church of the Immaculate Heart of Mary in 1915. The theme for our Jubilee Celebration “We Remember, We Believe, We Celebrate” will be threaded throughout all the events that we are planning for both the Parish and for our Community as well during the year. I hope you will try to attend as many as possible for spiritual enrichment or fellowship within our Parish or Community families. Stay tuned for announcements in our upcoming weekly Bulletins.

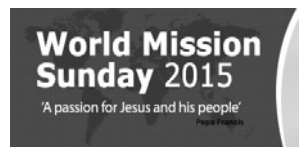
