

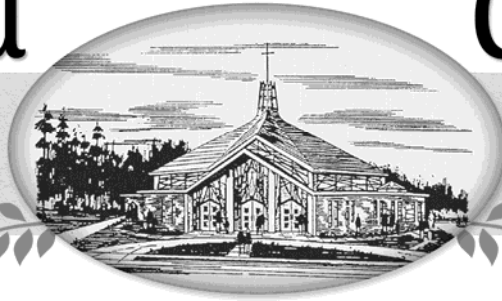

Message from the Pastor:

In today's Gospel of Luke we hear a very powerful Gospel in that Jesus reads from a scroll of the prophet Isaiah about the Servant of the Lord. He then announces to the crowd in the synagogue that He is the fulfillment of Scripture: "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Luke had a clear understanding of who Jesus was "after investigating everything accurately anew" in order to proclaim the Good News. From the very beginning, what Jesus came to fulfill has been observed, treasured, and handed down. Now, we are to be the bearers of the Good News so that others may "realize the certainty" of the story we have received. As Jesus proclaimed glad tidings "in the power of the Spirit," so must our proclamation of the Good News come from the Spirit who dwells within us. In today's social media world we all are too familiar with the power of words that shape our identity and our way of life. Society offers conflicting messages that often pull us in many directions. In the midst of all these competing words, God's word is the true source of our identity as Christian people.

Next Sunday, January 31st, is the Feast of St. John Bosco, founder of the Salesian Society. Ordained a priest in 1841, he went to work in Turin, Italy, where the industrial revolution was attracting waves of young people to the city. The misery and abandonment of these poor or troubled youth led John to dedicate his life to helping the young through missionary work and education. As many of you know, the Salesians were trailblazers of our Christian faith in this area and were responsible for building the first Catholic Church of Immaculate Heart of Mary in Mahwah, our Parish Parochial School staffed by Salesian Sisters, as well as Don Bosco High School in Ramsey. The extraordinary teaching, care and concern by the many Salesians since our humble beginnings in 1915 are a testament to St. John Bosco and his understanding and love for all the young. As we continue in our 100th Jubilee year, let celebrate and cherish our precious children and all that they have accomplished in their young lives as they continue on their journey of faith!

As we continue to live each day proclaiming the good news from the Spirit who dwells within us, I would like to close with part of the Prayer of the Salesian Family:

Saint John Bosco, Father and Teacher of Youth...

***We ask for a heart full of kindness, constancy in work, wisdom in discernment,
courage to bear witness to a sense of the Church
and to generosity in our ministry and families.***

***Obtain for us from the Lord the grace to be faithful to our call from you
and help us so that, guided by Mary Help of Christians, and together with the young,
we may follow with joy, the path that leads to love! Amen.***
