

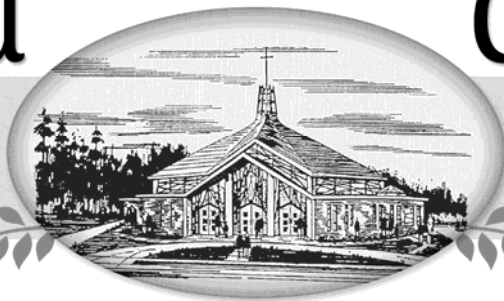

Message from the Pastor:

It seems that we are just about packing away all of our Christmas decorations, January quickly flew by, and Lent is now upon us, beginning this week on Ash Wednesday, February 10th! With the spirit of Christ's birth still glowing bright from within us, Pope Francis, in his recent message for a special Lenten period to take place this year within the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, says that it is a season to be lived more intensely, as a "privileged moment", to celebrate and experience the transforming miracle of divine Mercy. "For all of us, then, the season of Lent in this Jubilee Year is a favourable time to overcome our existential alienation by listening to God's word and by practicing the works of mercy. In the corporal works of mercy we touch the flesh of Christ in our brothers and sisters who need to be fed, clothed, sheltered, visited; in the spiritual works of mercy – counsel, instruction, forgiveness, admonishment and prayer – we touch more directly our own sinfulness.

The corporal and spiritual works of mercy must never be separated." I recommend reading the full text of his message as it will give us many things to ponder on, pray on, act on or alter/change in our lives as we begin this Lenten season. Ash Wednesday Masses/Ashes are at 8am, 12 noon, and 7:30pm (in Polish); Prayer Service/Ashes at 4pm and 6:30pm.

On Thursday, February 11th, let us remember to pray for all those who are ill, along with their caregivers, on the World Day of the Sick. We will also celebrate the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes with our own Healing Mass at 12 noon. All are invited and will receive the Sacrament of the Sick. Please let us know at the Rectory if anyone needs transportation.

In today's Gospel, Peter begins by allowing Jesus to take command of his boat. He moves to allowing Jesus to take command of his heart, openly confessing the truth about himself - "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." Peter's trust is rewarded not only by a huge catch of fish, but by Jesus' call to become a disciple. Peter, James, and John, overwhelmed by the presence of Jesus, drop everything and follow Him. Like them, let us allow Jesus to take command of our lives and our hearts.

As we prepare our own personal Lenten journey of introspection and preparation, I'd like to close, as Pope Francis did in his Lenten message, with a request to Mary, our Mother, to help us on our journey:

"Let us not waste this season of Lent, so favourable a time for conversion! We ask this through the maternal intercession of the Virgin Mary, who, encountering the greatness of God's mercy freely bestowed upon her, was the first to acknowledge her lowliness (cf. Lk 1:48) and to call herself the Lord's humble servant (cf. Lk 1:38)."

Lastly, I'd like to express my sincere gratitude and thanks for the generosity and sacrifices from everyone for our outstanding Christmas collection of \$37,287!!! And a special thank you to all those who couldn't make Mass last Sunday due to the blizzard but are still sending in their weekly donations to our Parish!

Lenten Guidelines

It is a traditional principle of Christian spirituality that a fundamental part of repentance, of turning away from sin and back to God, includes some form of penance such as Fasting and Abstinence.

Generally fasting refers to restrictions on the quantity of the food we eat and when we consume it, while abstinence refers to the avoidance of particular foods.

Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of both Fast and Abstinence.

Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

On a day of Fast, only one (1) full meal is permitted while on a day of Abstinence, meat should not be eaten.
