Message from the Pastor:

Happy 4th of July!

"For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters. But do not use this freedom as an opportunity for the flesh: rather serve one another through love."

Galatians 5:13

For all the sacrifices so many before us have made to build and defend our country we are grateful! Let us continue to pray for peaceful solutions for all world conflicts - whether here at home or abroad - so that everyone can live in peaceful harmony as Jesus has directed us.

In today's Gospel of Luke, we hear about Jesus sending out the disciples to spread His message of peace. He instructs His disciples to take nothing with them as they do this. When they enter a house, they are to greet the people by saying, "Peace to this household." Ordinary Time

We are now in the longest season of the liturgical year – **Ordinary Time**. It refers to all those parts of the Catholic Church’s liturgical year that are not included in the major seasons of the Church, which are Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. Prior to Vatican II these periods were referred to as the Sundays after Epiphany and the Sundays after Pentecost.

Depending on the year, Ordinary Time lasts for either 33-34 weeks and is broken into two distinct portions of the calendar. The first begins the Monday after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (In 2016-January 11) and ends on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday. The second begins on the Monday after Pentecost (In 2016 – May 16) and will run until the evening prayer of the first Sunday of Advent. Ordinary Time is called “ordinary” because the weeks are numbered. The Latin word *ordinalis*, which means to numbers in a series, stems from the Latin word *ordo* from which we get the English word *Order*. During this time, the emphasis in the Mass and the Church’s daily prayer is on the Christ’s teaching and His life among his disciples.

Many people think ordinary time refers to the parts of the church year that are unimportant. But nothing could be further from the truth Ordinary Time is in fact the ordered life of the Church – the period in which we live our lives neither in feasting (as in the Christmas and Easter seasons) or in penance (as in Advent and Lent) but in watchfulness and expectation of the second Coming of Christ. Thus for Catholics, Ordinary Time is the part of the year in which Christ, the Lamb of God walks among us and transforms our lives!
