

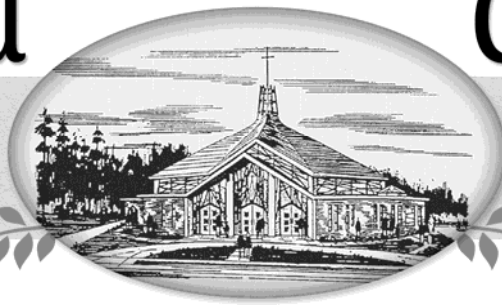

Message from the Pastor:

In a little under a month from now with the close of the liturgical year on November 20th, Pope Francis' Jubilee Year of Mercy will also come to an end. When the Holy Year of Mercy began, Pope Francis said, "I have decided to announce an Extraordinary Jubilee which has at its centre the mercy of God. It will be a Holy Year of Mercy. We want to live in the light of the word of the Lord: 'Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful' (cf. Lk 6:36)." As we go forward now, let us never forget Mercy is the caring for the needs of people's minds, hearts, and lives. It means to share in God's forgiveness and love. As we continue in this **Respect Life Month** let us pray this week for those nearing the end of life that God may strengthen their faith and comfort them through others' loving kindness, support and love!

In today's Gospel of Luke we hear Jesus tell another parable. The Pharisee is faithful to pious practices but he misses the heart of prayer. We cannot honestly pray to God if we judge harshly and set ourselves apart from those we meet every day. The tax collector is justified because he admits that he has not been in right relationships – "me a sinner." True humility is honesty about who we are before both God and others. True prayer leads us to God exalting us "went home justified" because we have humbled ourselves before God and have exalted others through our just actions toward them.

Next Sunday, October 30th is Priesthood Sunday. Pope Francis said recently when addressing a group of Seminarians and Novices: "Becoming a priest or a man or woman religious is not primarily our own decision.... Rather it is the response to a call and to a call of love." Let us pray for young people in our community that they may respond generously with open hearts and willing spirits if the Lord calls them to the priesthood, diaconate, or consecrated life:

**God our Father, we thank you for calling men and women to serve
in your Son's Kingdom as priests, deacons, religious, and consecrated persons.
Send your Holy Spirit to help us respond generously and courageously to your call.
May our community of faith support vocations of sacrificial love in our Youth.
We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you
and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.**

As we approach All Soul's Day on Wednesday, November 2nd, there are envelopes in the Church lobby as well as in your home mailings for Mass Intentions for the souls of all our dearly departed. We will remember and pray for them throughout the month of November.

Feast of St. Simon and Jude - October 28

St. Jude is the Patron Saint of Hope and Impossible Causes and one of Jesus' original twelve Apostles. He preached the Gospel with great passion, often in the most difficult circumstances. Through the power of the Holy Spirit, he made profound differences in people's lives as he offered them the Word of God. St. Jude died a martyr's death for his unwavering faith. His body was later brought to Rome and placed in a crypt under St. Peter's Basilica. (Shrine of St. Jude)
