**“Let the one among you who is without sin
be the first to throw a stone at her.”**

In today's Gospel of John, the Scribes and Pharisees brought an adulterous woman to Jesus and “made her stand in the middle.” In their self-righteousness, they wished to make an example of her as a grave sinner deserving of death. Ironically, Jesus makes an example of them as sinners: they turned away from him and “went away one by one.” The woman, however, remained with Jesus. Our own work during Lent is like that of the adulterous woman: truthfully face our sinfulness and faithfully remain with Jesus. Though we sin, Jesus only wishes new life for us.

In the First Reading from Isaiah, Paul admonishes us not to be prisoners of our sinfulness but to strain forward to the new life that lies ahead. This new life is the “supreme good of knowing Christ Jesus” and remaining with him. When we focus exclusively on our own sinfulness, we can easily lose sight of our goodness and God's mercy. Jesus responds even to profound sin with even more profound mercy.

This Tuesday, April 9th at 7pm, our Lenten Pardon & Peace Reconciliation Service will be held with outside priests available for private confessions.

Please mark your calendars and join us for the Divine Mercy Novena beginning on Good Friday, April 19th through Saturday, April 27th at 8:30am after the 8am Mass. On Good Friday, 1937, Jesus requested that St. Faustina make a special novena before the Feast of Divine Mercy from Good Friday through the following Saturday. By means of a specific prayer, she was to bring to His Heart a different group of souls each day and thus immerse them in the ocean of His mercy, begging the Father – on the strength of Jesus' Passion – for graces for them. You are all invited to join the faithful around the world in this beautiful and powerful novena.

As we now approach these last weeks of Lent and Holy Week, let us continue to prepare ourselves for Jesus' glorious Resurrection -- in our thoughts, in our actions and in our deeds. Please see our schedule of Masses and Services throughout Holy Week outlined in this Bulletin beginning with the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of Sacred Heart in Newark on Monday, April 15th at 8pm. If anyone would like to attend this very special Mass where the Holy Oils are consecrated and blessed, please see me. Everyone is invited.

Lastly, I would like to bring to your attention that an email scam is currently spreading throughout the Archdiocese, giving the appearance that one of the priests, often the pastor, is trying to enlist your financial assistance in some way. Unless you have initiated an email to me or Fr. Marcin and are awaiting a response, it is suggested that you treat the email as suspect and delete it rather than open or respond to it. If you think you've received an email or phone call that might be suspect, please call me at the Parish Office and our local Police Dept.

WE ARE NOT ALONE

Today's Gospel calls to mind the power of community. The woman caught in the act of adultery was persecuted by the mob, thus representing the negative side of communal power. Then, Jesus incites his brilliant gift of reason into the angry mob, and just like that, they disappear. None remain except the one sinner and her savior, the most powerful community of good that one can attain.

In Christ, we form part of the union of his greater community known as the Communion of Saints. In this group we find great holy members of the Faith like St. Therese and St. John of the Cross as well as lesser-known inhabitants of the heavenly homeland such as deceased members. Furthermore, this community includes us, the Church Militant, who strive for holiness as we make it through our earthly journey.

The Gospel reminds us that in our times of most need Jesus is present. Not only is He present, but so are of the rest of his children, those whom we call saints. May we never forget that such a powerful community for good is constantly in our corner. We need only to call upon them for help.

LENT PARDON & PEACE: A SERVICE OF RECONCILIATION TUESDAY, APRIL 9 – 7PM



We invite you to come together as a community to seek Pardon & Peace from our Loving God!

This service of communal reconciliation will include song, scripture, time for examination of conscience, and prayer around the cross. We will pray together for forgiveness of our sins and a deeper conversion to Christ. At the end of the service, there will be an opportunity for you to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance in individual confession.

To help us get in the right frame of mind let us reflect on a section of the Apostolic Letter “*Misericordia et misera*” of Pope Francis in November 2016:

“The celebration of mercy takes place in a very particular way in the Sacrament of Penance and Reconciliation. Here we feel the embrace of the Father, who comes forth to meet us and grant us the grace of being once more his sons and daughters. We are sinners and we bear the burden of contradiction between what we wish to do and what we do in fact (cf. Rom 7:14-21). Yet grace always precedes us and takes on the face of the mercy that effects our reconciliation and pardon. God makes us understand his great love for us precisely when we recognize that we are sinners. Grace is stronger than sin: it overcomes every possible form of resistance, because love conquers all.” (cf. 1 Cor 13:7).

In the sacrament of Forgiveness God shows us the way to turn back to him and invites us to experience his closeness anew. This pardon can be obtained by beginning, first of all, to live in charity. The Apostle Peter tells us this when he writes that ‘love covers a multitude of sins’ (1 Pet 4:8). Only God forgives sins, but he asks that we be ready to forgive others even as he forgives us: ‘Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us’ (Mt 6:12). How sad it is when our hearts are closed and unable to forgive! Resentment, anger and revenge gain the upper hand, making our lives miserable and blocking a joyful commitment to mercy.”

Whether you celebrate this sacrament regularly, or if it’s been a while since you’ve celebrated it, this Pardon & Peace Lenten Penance will help us come closer to the Lord and his infinite mercy!

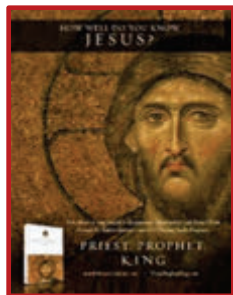
