WHAT IS #IGIVECATHOLIC?

#iGiveCatholic is the first-ever online giving day for the Catholic community, celebrating our unique heritage. It is a call to share of our blessings with the Church and those the Church helps and supports in our communities.

This year, #iGiveCatholic is being celebrated by 6 Catholic dioceses in the southeast region: The Archdiocese of New Orleans, Diocese of Austin, Diocese of Baton Rouge, Diocese of Biloxi, Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux, and Diocese of Jackson.

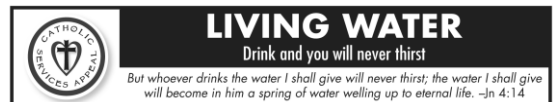

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION GUIDELINES

A minimum of two people should be present during adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament, mainly for reasons of safety. If something happens to one of the adorers (ex. medical emergency) the other can call for aid while ensuring the Blessed Sacrament exposed in the monstrance is not left unattended. Again, to be safe, the Eucharist in the monstrance is vulnerable. Plus, out of reverence and courtesy, our Lord should not be left alone.
