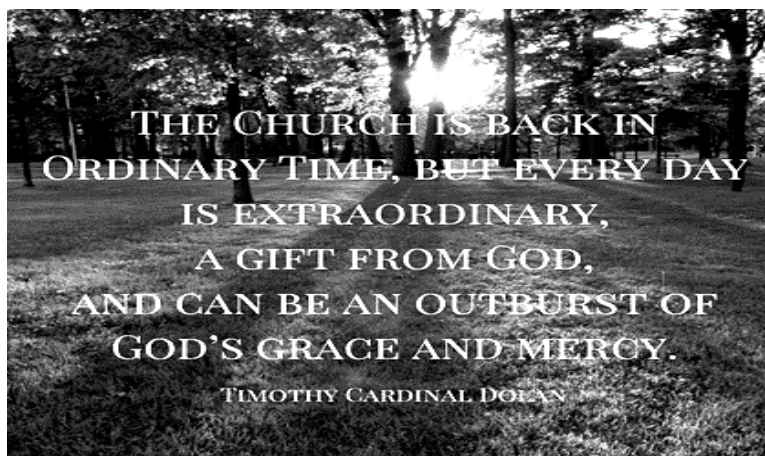
K-8 Religious Education is on break until the Fall

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The cathedral is a treasure in a diocese and in our tradition. It is not simply a "big church," as some say; some parish churches are larger. What makes a cathedral is the presence of the chair, called a cathedra (Latin for seat) reserved for the bishop. There are many instances in our country of a local church (diocese) outgrowing a cathedral. In Baltimore and St. Louis, the former cathedrals are historic treasures in the heart of the old city, but new and larger structures now function as the seat of the bishop.

When a bishop dies or retires, it is said that "the seat is vacant," and when the new bishop is installed, the central ritual is the moment when the decree of the Holy Father is read and the new bishop is escorted to the cathedra. No one but the bishop sits in the cathedra during a ritual, but in Los Angeles the cathedra in the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels is accessible, and no one seems to mind when a visitor tries the cathedra out for the bishop's point of view.

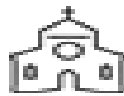

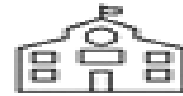

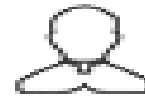

Parish Center Renovations

The renovation of the chapel continues to grind on! We hope, at the time of this writing, to see a major transformation in the parish center by the time you are reading this. The glass for the front of the chapel will hopefully arrive this week. That will enable us to take down the green construction fence and get the chapel back to something approaching normalcy. There will still be some work to do, but we hope to have the chapel far more functional in just a short time.

Meanwhile, we are planning to do another part of the ongoing renovation of the Parish Center. The front doors, relics from the days when the Center was the Convent for the sisters who taught in our school, are finally being replaced. The new doors will be made of metal and glass, will be light-weight and much easier to open and close.

The doors will be replaced over three days, June 28-30. As a result there will be no access to the parish center these days. There will be a receptionist for normal hours, but they will not be able to go to the door to let people in. All inquiries should be made by telephone during those days.

We apologize for the inconvenience this might pose for people who want mass cards – we will do everything possible to minimize that inconvenience – and we ask your understanding as we make the Parish Center that much more welcoming for our parishioners.

And We're Off!

You have heard Msgr. Ivers and me speak about the year-long preaching program we have been participating in. WE started with a conference at Notre Dame in July, met for a week-long workshop in Tampa, FL in January, and now concludes in the third week of June with a three-day conference back in Notre Dame. Msgr. and I will be leaving on Tuesday 6/19 and returning Friday 6/22.

I want to extend my personal thanks to everyone who participated in the month – long class on the “Four Solas” of the Reformation. Originally conceived of as a class for those going on the trip to Germany in September, it turned into a lively month of discussion and debate, food and fellowship on Wednesday nights for all kinds of people. Our last meeting had over 35 people squished into the Angelo Room – yet it did not feel cramped. We were enjoying ourselves too much! (The wine people smuggled in helped with that – don’t tell Mike Ward, the Parish Manager!)

People have asked and yes, we will do that sort of thing again in the fall. I and Maryann welcome suggestions for classes.
