

MASS COORDINATORS 2018

Training days:

- Main day: Saturday, October 13th, 9am
- Make up: Friday, October 17th, 6pm

Requirements:

- They must be fully initiated into the Church with the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist.
- Must always ensure that their lives are in conformity with the teachings of the Church, **including the teaching on married life and publicly affirm the magisterium of the Church.**

FAQs:

- *What are the duties of a Mass Coordinator?*
 - Prepare the sacred books and aids for the priest
 - Dress the altar
 - Prepare the credence table with everything the priest will need to celebrate the mass
 - Make sure all the volunteers check-in, and find alternate in case someone doesn't show up.
 - Coordinate Altar servers
 - Coordinate the collection.
 - Serve as EMHC when needed
 - Coordinate with EMHCs and Ushers to bring communion to those who cannot walk.
 - Put the sacred vessels, vestments, and cloths back in place, and leave the sacristy organized and ready for the next mass.
- When do Mass Coordinators serve? (at every mass!)
 - *Sunday Mass*
 - *Daily Mass*
 - *Funeral Masses*
 - *Baptisms*
 - *Holy Days of Obligation and Feast days*
- *If one sings, or is an usher/lector/EMHC, can one also be a Mass Coordinator?*

You can be trained in multiple ministries, but only serve in one capacity at each mass. However, Mass Coordinators are always trained as EMHCs and often serve in this capacity when not enough EMHCs are available.
- *What is the commitment like?*

For Sunday masses, you will be scheduled according to your availability and mass and frequency preference. Faithfulness in liturgical ministry demands attention to details and readiness to adapt to changing circumstances.
