Please contact the office if you are able and willing to help with this!

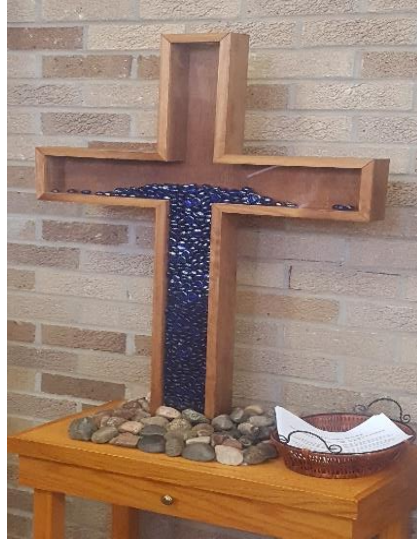
NEWS FROM MRS. REED
