**A reminder: All Saints' Day is a Holy Day of Obligation. Please note in the Mass schedule above that there are two Masses; the anticipatory on October 31 at 6:00 p.m. and the Mass of the day on November 1 at 7:00 a.m.**

**By an ancient tradition, priests are permitted to celebrate three Mass for the souls undergoing purification on All Souls Day, November 2. You are strongly encouraged to attend one or all three Masses (7:00 a.m., 12:00 noon, and 6:00 p.m.) and offer your intentions for the Poor Souls who are comforted by our prayers and works of charity done in their name. Prayers and works of charity are expressions of love and such love is the only thing that**

## **transcends the limitations of this world and death itself.**

**All Masses for the month of November are being offered for the souls who departed this life in friendship with God but are in need of purification.** Please consider making the effort to attend a daily Mass and offer *your* Mass for friends and family members who have passed from this life. Your prayers and works of charity are great comforts as they complete their purification before entering Heaven.

**Daylight Savings Time Ends on Sunday, November 5.** Please make sure to set your clocks one hour ahead on Saturday night before going to bed.

**Many thanks to all who made the Spaghetti Dinner last Sunday such a success.** We had a great guest speaker, Mrs. Kathleen Billings from Chicago, thanks to Mary Ann Cummins. We had great food, thanks to Val and Jim Spanos for the marvelous meatballs and sauce and to Sharon and Allan Antognazzi for the excellent spaghetti. It is very difficult to get such a huge amount of spaghetti to the right al dente texture. Many thanks to Chad Reckard who spent considerable time setting up our new equipment for video and sound. And many thanks to Honey Harriet who spent hours decorating the hall. Thanks to all who helped to set up and clean up. And thanks to our young people who helped as well.

**Many thanks to all who took the course "The Dead Are Not Dead."** I hope reading the book, The Biblical Basis for Purgatory, and the discussions have given you a better appreciation for the Church's teaching on a purification after death for those who died in friendship with God but did not use this life to fully unite their wills to His. It is just one of many signs of God's merciful love. There may be a "follow up" course next year.

**Painting the interior of the Church may have to be put on hold.** During a routine maintenance check on all the plant's heating

systems that we have done before the winter weather settles in, cracks were found in the heating elements of the two furnaces that are on top of the fellowship section of the parish hall. There is a possible danger of carbon monoxide poisoning. You might recall this was the reason why we replaced all the CCD classroom heaters shortly after I arrived. The Finance Council will determine the best course of action to take at its Tuesday meeting. We do not have the budget to replace the heating / air conditioning units and paint the interior of the Church. Clearly, addressing the heating / air conditioning system has to take priority over painting.

**Altar server schedules for November have been sent out.** Thank you to parents who have informed me when their sons cannot serve. I cannot, however, rewrite the schedule.

**Thank you to Kathy Urruty, Laurie Johnson and Joan Gampetro** for taking the surplices and cassocks used by the younger guys for laundering. That saves me a great deal of time which I appreciate. These ladies have graciously offered to take this on as their ministry to the parish.

**So, you can plan for Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 23.** At the request of a number of families the Thanksgiving Day Mass will be held at 9:00 a.m. There have been complaints that having Mass at 10:00 a.m. is too late for those who have to do the cooking and cleaning to get ready for their guests. I hope this change in time helps.

**So, you can plan for Christmas.** The Christmas Eve Masses fall on a Sunday. There will be two: 5:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. The Christmas Morning Mass will be at 9:00 a.m.
