She was a remarkably gifted, talented and faithful person endowed with great intelligence, immense energy and compassion that she placed at the service of our Church. Carol loved the Lord and saw that everything she did had to reflect the love she had for Him. She particularly loved the priests even if they could be a bit trying at times and did all she could to help them deal with some of the more challenging aspects of administration. I shall miss her. Please keep her and her family in your prayers.

An update from Fr. Pete:

First, a heartfelt "thank you" to all those who have sent get well cards and offers of prayers for healing. And another heartfelt "thank you" to all who graciously made a meal and

brought it over to the rectory for both Fr. Larry and myself. The meals were wonderful and more than enough!

The discomfort I currently have is not so much with the artificial knee as it is all the muscles of the leg. I am essentially re-learning how to walk properly and have to repeat the mantra to myself "lift leg, lower heel, then toe, move foot in." Thankfully I have not been on any pain medication since leaving the hospital.

The physical therapy is going well. I have been told that I am ahead of schedule which is nice to hear but being somewhat impatient by nature I think I should be much further along. I am continually reminded that this process takes time, to go slow, not over do things, and that I am no longer a young man. When my pride permits me to forget these realities my body does not hesitate to remind me, and not so gently I might add. It is frustrating and annoying. But it is what it is and instructive for when I have to have the other leg done which is also being distorted by osteoarthritis.

I attempted to concelebrate one Mass last Sunday with Fr. Larry and was very disappointed how hard that was for me. It is the "static" position, the standing in one place that is most difficult and the most painful. I paid for it that evening.

This leads me to a difficult decision when Fr. Larry returns to Seattle. I will try to put in a full weekend of Masses on Mother's Day Weekend as a test run. If I find that I cannot do it a letter will be sent out to all registered parishioners the following Tuesday to inform them that I shall have to drop one of the weekend Masses. We will have Mass on Saturday at 5:00 p.m. and one Mass on Sunday at 9:00 a.m. I understand no one wants to see their "preferred" Mass time dropped. I hope that it does not have to come to this, but I have to be realistic.

Bishop Biegler has been informed. If you wish to complain you may reach him at 1-866-790-0014. Keep in mind that when Bishop was here a few months ago he asked me, "Does Buffalo really need three

weekend Masses?" I told him that in all honesty it really doesn't.
