I realize that this Diocesan appeal is very unpopular and there is very little I can do to other than what I already have over

the years; i.e. stressing that we are part of the Diocese, not an independent operation.

All I can do is ask you to please consider making a contribution so it lowers the amount we shall have to withdraw from savings to pay off the debt to the Diocese. Every little bit helps. There are envelopes at the Church entrances. Thank you.

“Fr. Pete...You often refer to this life as a ‘pilgrimage.’ What do you mean by that?” I refer you to the following meditation offered by Mother Elvira Petrozzi who founded the Communita Cenacolo that ministers to the lost and the desperate in sixty-three houses in fifteen countries. The reflection comes from the July edition of the ***Magnificat***.

What is a pilgrimage? It is a symbol of our life that is sometimes long and sometimes brief. We do not know how long it will last, but it is a journey toward God. We walk toward the Lord because He is the North Star, the point of attraction on our compass which guides our journey. If we lose our direction, we go to the right or to the left and our journey wavers. To go on a pilgrimage means to embrace our spiritual poverty because a pilgrim is one who accepts God’s call to be poor in spirit. Think about when people traveled on foot with a piece of bread in a sack and when it was gone it was necessary for them to extend their hand and beg. To have a spirit of poverty means to recognize that we are poor people in need of everything, above all the grace of the Lord that fills our heart.

Being on a pilgrimage also means to recognize our need for each other. When we walk together, we need one another’s help. When one person gets tired, the other sustains him; when one runs too fast, he needs someone to stop him. This is what it means to be pilgrims in the name of the

Lord: to discover that our brothers and sisters are gifts to us, a richness in our lives.....We go because we have a need to find something. We need to find Someone. It is true that we have met Him so many times but we always feel a greater need to encounter Him.

“Fr. Pete...How much does it cost to run the CCD program? Shouldn’t there be a charge for each child to reduce our expenses?”

The budget for this fiscal year is \$7,500 which includes the cost of the Summer Vacation Bible School program that has become so popular over the years. Through the kindness of the Borgialli family, memorials made in honor of the late Mary Lou Borgialli have been earmarked for CCD amounting to \$2,100.00. The CCD Director, Carol Gagliano, is very frugal and uses the funding she receives wisely.

I have never believed in charging parents fees to send their children for religious instruction. I have always seen this as part and parcel of what parishes are supposed to do. Your next pastor may think differently.
