Pastor's Notes:

The Advent Wreath

The exact origins of the Advent wreath is unknown, however there is evidence of pre-Christian Germanic peoples using wreaths with lit candles during the cold and dark days of December. In the middle ages, the Germanic peoples began incorporating a lighted wreath into the Christian season of Advent. It didn't gain widespread popularity until the 1800s and it wasn't until the 1900s that German immigrants brought the tradition to America. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life found in Christ. Four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are violet (purple) and one is rose. The violet candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and good works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, which is the Sunday of rejoicing, because we have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when our preparation is now half over and we are close to Christmas. As we move closer to the Nativity of our Lord, let us continue to prepare our hearts and souls for the coming of Christ.
