A message from Fr. Bill

"Which Commandment in the Law is the greatest?"

A scholar of the law, in order to test Jesus, asks Him this question, "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" The debate over which is a super-commandment was widely discussed at that time. The first part of Jesus' answer is derived from the Mosaic Law, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with your whole heart, and with your whole being, and with your whole strength" (Dt 6:5). Love is constant attention to another human being and, moreover, love must be inventive, so inventive in fact, that you can never consider yourself free of its unrelenting demands. Jesus added to the first part of what has come to be known as the Great Commandment a "second [part that] is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself" The universal love of God the Father for all His sons and daughters, then, serves as a standard to judge loving service to others. This second part is like the first and, since they are interrelated, this addition to the Law must be understood and practiced in an identical way as you would love the Lord God. When understood in the sense that part two must be lived out in keeping with part one, it entails that doing anything contrary to any neighbor's good can never be understood as corresponding to God's will or to the love we profess to have for Him. The concrete determination of what must explicitly be done to or for others and to decide what that is in any given moment is the personal responsibility of every believer. The litmus test in regard to action done on behalf of another is to ask yourself what you would do or would like to do for yourself where you in a similar situation.
