A message from Fr. Bill

This week's Gospel constitutes one parable of a three-part discourse by Saint Matthew on how to live, today, in the perspective of that final Day of the Lord which is inevitable, yet unknowable. Like most parables, this pericope is constructed upon a situation that was part of ordinary, first-century life and a custom associated with weddings. It was customary for the bridesmaids to go to the bride's house and wait there with her until the groom came to lead her from her family home to his which would become their home. Then, in a procession through the streets, all of them would go to the wedding hall. What seemed ordinary even commonplace has unlikely elements introduced into the predictable: the overly-long delay in the groom's arrival, the five maids seeking oil even though the hour was impossibly late, the barring of the door—an action which was rude and coarse, the wise maids who acted selfishly though were not chastened for it, or the groom's rejection of late-comers. The parable, though, seeks to illustrate how to live now with the ultimate end of history as a given the Lord's return in glory. An unknown point that requires patience and vigilance because it is unforeseeable and, when it happens, it will be sudden and unexpected. Moreover, when that Day does come, all who are unprepared and taken by surprise will not be able to be helped. When the wedding feast of the Lamb dawns, the path to the kingdom will be barred and, so, those who have acted as if the Parousia was so far in the future that it warranted little or no consideration will be foolish, as the maids who did not have enough oil. This final and fatal Day, though uncertain, is not meant to be feared because the Lord's coming again in glory is meant to incite watchfulness and to heighten our attention. Longing for the Beloved, those who love the Lord are to gaze through the darkness of night trying to perceive the signs of His return. Those gathered together in that common faith are always ready to depart, at a moment's notice, in a joy-filled procession that eagerly awaits the Bridegroom's arrival!
