MUSIC AT THE BASILICA

Music for Trinity Sunday

There is so much great music for Trinity Sunday in the Church's tradition. The composer of our Offertory motet, Jacob Handl (also known as Gal-lus), was born in Slovenia in 1550, and spent most of his professional life in the service of the Catholic Church in Austria and Bohemia until his untimely death in Prague at the age of 41. He composed 445 motets and twenty masses, works that are a sophisticated synthesis of Franco-Flemish, German, and Italian styles. Rhythmic imagination, harmonic invention, and a counter-Reformation clarity of text are evident in Duo Seraphim, a motet for double chorus that aptly depicts the antiphonal call-and-response of the heavenly beings seen by the prophet Isaiah in his mystical vision (also found, of course, in the Sanctus). A work for double choir, the organ takes the place of an antiphonal choir.



The Communion hymn comes from the Laudario of Cortona (near Arezzo), a collection of sixty-six 13th-century religious songs. These songs, discovered in the archives of the Museum of the Etruscan Academy in 1876, are songs of praise written by lay communities, similar to the Cantic of All Creatures written by St. Francis. It is unusual in that it has both text and music; only two of two hundred such songbooks contain both. E. T. A. Hoffman (1776—1822), the great proto-Romantic writer, artist, poet, and composer, wrote the short Gloria Patri as part of his study of church music; as a music critic, he wrote admiringly about the style of Palestrina and Renaissance masters, which influenced the reception of Palestrina by the Romantic age into modernity.

Léon Boëllmann (1862—1897) was a French composer of Alsatian origin, known for a small number of compositions for organ. His best-known composition is Suite gothique (1895), still very much a staple of the organ repertoire. At the age of nine, he entered the École de Musique Classique et Religieuse (L'École Niedermeyer) in Paris, where he studied with its director, Gustave Lefèvre, and with Eugène Gigout. Boëllmann there won first prizes in piano, organ, counterpoint, fugue, plainsong, and composition. After his graduation in 1881, Boëllmann was hired as organiste de choeur at the Church of St. Vincent de Paul in the 10th arrondissement of Paris, and six years later he became cantor and organiste titulaire, a position he held until his early death from tuberculosis. During the sixteen years of his professional life, Boëllmann composed about 160 pieces in all genres. Though faithful to the style of Franck and an admirer of Saint-Saëns, Boëllmann has a Post-romantic esthetic, which, especially in his organ works, demonstrates "remarkable sonorities."



Holy Doors of Mercy

The Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral is honored, with the blessing of Cardinal Dolan, to have HOLY DOORS at its sister church, the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood for the duration of the Holy Year. With these Holy Doors open 24hrs a day, pilgrims passing through them will benefit from indulgences and blessings. Pilgrims will reflect on the major theme of the Holy Year – the universal reach of God's mercy – by viewing a display of presepio, crafted in this city of Naples by La Scarabattola.

For those in a state of grace and fulfilling the other prescribed conditions, a plenary indulgence may be gained once day by passing through the Holy Doors. A plenary indulgence removes all punishment due to sin.

Those seeking the indulgence are encouraged to begin a pilgrimage starting at the Basilica of St. Patrick's Old Cathedral where a Prayer of Mercy may be said. The pilgrim then may proceed down to the Shrine Church of the Most Precious Blood where the Holy Doors of Mercy are located.



Stained Glass Windows

With great joy, four refurbished windows will be installed this coming week in the sanctuary area, two windows on each side. Keep in mind, that the restoration of the windows is a monumental effort since that tracery sections of the windows (the woodwork that frames the stained glass) had to be hand hewn from hard wood. This had to be replaced because the old frames and tracery were so deteriorated that they no longer could safely hold the glass in place. The remaining stained glass windows will be completed over the spring and summer.

The stained glass that you now see is the same glass that was there before the restoration. The glass looks new because each piece was cleaned and in some cases replaced where there were breaks or pieces missing.

Weekday Masses

As a result of the work being done inside and outside the Basilica during the installation of the four stained glass windows, the church will be closed from Monday to Friday for the next two weeks. The weekday Masses - 8:00AM & 12:10PM - will be celebrated in St. Michael's Russian Catholic Church at 266 Mulberry Street.

SAINT ANTHONY


NOVENA: Tuesday, May
