#### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

As we come to the end of July, summer is once again going by way too fast. To begin, I just want to mention once again the Renew and Rebuild Capital Campaign, which we hope to wrap up early in the Fall. Therefore, if you have not yet made a pledge to the Campaign, please try to do so by the end of the Summer. We simply cannot accomplish all the wonderful projects we have outlined for the good of our Church without your help in reaching our goal. We have raised so far over 1.5 million dollars in pledges. That puts us about 70% of the way to our goal of 2.1 million with only 10% of our registered parishioners making a pledge so far. That is truly amazing. If the other 90% does whatever they can, we will have no trouble surpassing our goal and accomplishing some wonderful things for our beautiful Church. If you have any questions whatsoever about this Campaign, please reach out to me at the Rectory or in the back of the Church. I cannot thank you enough for your unfailing generosity and concern for our Parish.

With our Gospel today from the beginning of the Sixth Chapter of Saint John's Gospel, known as the "Bread of Life Discourse," we begin a five-week catechesis on the Eucharist. We begin today with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves and fish, which was a sign pointing to the gift and the mystery of the Eucharist. Just as Jesus fed the multitudes in the desert, so too does He continue to feed the multitudes throughout the world through His Church with the Bread of Life, His own flesh and blood, in the Eucharist. It would be so good if all of us would take the time over these next five weeks to prayerfully read this Sixth Chapter of the Gospel of John to deepen our faith in and understanding of the mystery of the Holy Eucharist, the heart and soul of our Catholic Faith and the source and summit of our Christian life.

This Gospel presents a beautiful image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus as He sees the hunger of these thousands of people and has a deep desire to feed them. This points to a deeper hunger in every human heart, the hunger for God. And indeed, it is God Himself, our Lord Jesus Christ, who satisfies this hunger by feeding us with His own Flesh and Blood in the Eucharist. And just as Jesus instructed His disciples to pick up and gather all the fragments left over so that nothing would be wasted, so too at every

Mass is every Host left over after Holy Communion gathered up and placed in the Tabernacle, because even the tiniest fragment of the Eucharist is truly and entirely the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ, His Real Presence in our midst. And He is in our midst every day right here in the Tabernacle of our own beautiful Church waiting for us to allow Him to satisfy the deepest hunger of our souls. May God bless us all.

## RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

If you or someone you know have not been baptized or have not received the Sacraments of Holy Communion and/or

Confirmation, and would like to, the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is meant for you. The RCIA is the process by which the Church receives new members into our Catholic community through the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Eucharist). It consists of instruction sessions and liturgical celebrations meant to inform individuals of the teachings of the Catholic faith, to help them discern whether they wish to become Catholic and to prepare them to be received into the Church at Easter. These classes are also open to adult parishioners who would like to be more informed about their faith.


