### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

It is hard to believe that tomorrow, October 22<sup>nd</sup>, marks the first anniversary of the death of our beloved Father Brian Coffey. He is still missed by so many, especially at Good Samaritan Hospital, and so many of us here at Sacred Heart. Father Brian touched so many lives as he lived his priesthood with all his heart. We will never forget him here. May he rest in peace.

Today many of the children of our C.Y.O. basketball program, along with their coaches and families, will join us for a special blessing at the 10:00am Mass as they begin a new season. It is a good reminder that there is an intrinsic connection between the Gym and our Church, and that everything that happens here under the name of Sacred Heart is rooted in and flows from the practice of our Catholic Faith and our union with the Heart of Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass. May God watch over and bless all of our children and their families.

Also, today we join the Church throughout the world in observing World Mission Sunday. *Mission* is at the very heart of the Church's identity - that is to bring the Gospel of Jesus Christ to every person on earth. Our faith is not a private matter but is at the very core of who we are. And it takes a lot of conviction and a lot of courage to live our Faith authentically in this difficult world.

From the moment of our Lord's Command to His Apostles over 2000 years ago to "*go and teach all nations,*" heroic men and women right up to today have left their homelands to be missionaries in faraway lands. Certainly not all are called to leave home and go far away to spread the Gospel. However, by our baptism we are all called to be missionaries where we live and work. In fact, the real challenge today is not so much reaching those in distant lands who never heard of Christ but reaching those right here at home who need to be *re-introduced* to Him and His Church - so many who, for various reasons, have stopped practicing their faith, stopped coming to Sunday Mass, or just stopped believing. And with the crisis going on in our Church at large today, many more will be tempted to fall away.

Every human heart hungers and thirsts for God. We are in great need today of re-evangelizing our culture, of re-introducing Jesus and the timeless

Truth of the Gospel to the modern age. May we commit ourselves to being missionaries here at home by making the Love and Mercy of Jesus known to all, beginning in our own homes. May God bless us all.

### RENEW & REBUILD

I want to thank you for your patience last weekend as I spoke at all the Masses to make one last appeal for our Renew and Rebuild Capital Campaign, and for some very generous responses that have come in this past week. Please prayerfully consider making a pledge to support this Campaign for our Church if you have not already done so. We have raised 1.6 Million dollars in pledges from only 13% of our Parishioners participating so far. If everyone does whatever they can, we will be able to make our goal of 2.1 million dollars and accomplish some wonderful and necessary things for our Church building. And thank you to all who have already participated for your generosity, and for your love and concern for our Parish.

A few people had questions about the cost of each project we hope to accomplish for our Church and how it all adds up to the 2.1-million-dollar goal. The cost of each project outlined in the brochure are base-line estimates and do not include contingency and other costs that come with any construction contract. We will solicit bids from contractors for each project when the time comes for each one to commence over the next 5 years. Taking everything into consideration, the projected cost of all our projects is 1.6 million dollars. Added to that is the 26% of all monies raised that goes to the Archdiocese, plus our 2018 Cardinal's Appeal goal which is \$130,000. That is how we arrived at 2.1 million dollars for our goal. We have prepared a detailed breakdown of the costs of each project which I would be happy to share with anyone who would like to see it. I appreciate it so much when you bring your concerns to my attention. – Fr. Matthew

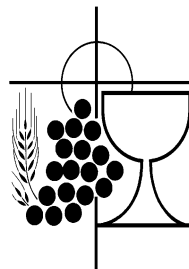
