### A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners:

Time continues to fly as we begin the month of November this week. This Thursday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, is the great Solemnity of *All Saints* as we honor the men and woman of every time and place who have achieved the goal of our Faith, our true homeland in Heaven. Our belief in the *Communion of Saints* reminds us that we are all connected in the Church by our Baptism - those of us still on our journey through this world on our way toward Heaven, the souls in Purgatory who are still being purified in final preparation for Heaven, and the Saints who have reached the goal of Heaven. We look to the example of heroic virtue and holiness in the lives of the saints to inspire us, and we seek their intercession to help us remain faithful in this world so that where they are we one day may be. We were made for Heaven, we were made to see God, we were made to be Saints. Every desire we have in our hearts for happiness and peace in this world is ultimately a longing for Heaven, a longing to see God.

The next day, Friday, November 2<sup>nd</sup>, we observe *All Souls Day*, when we pray in a special way for all the souls of the faithful departed who may still be need of our prayers in their final preparation for Heaven. The idea of praying for the dead goes back to the Old Testament where it says in the Book of Maccabees: *"It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead, that they might be loosed from their sins."* Jesus told us that to see God we must be pure: *"Blessed are the pure of heart for they shall see God."* The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: *"All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of Heaven."* The state in which the dead are purified in preparation for Heaven is what the Church has traditionally called *"Purgatory,"* from the Latin word, *"Purgare,"* which means *"to cleanse."*

Our prayers for the souls in Purgatory help them in this process of purification. And the greatest, most beautiful, and most powerful of all prayer we could offer for them is the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. This is what we will do as a Parish Family at the 7:30pm evening Mass this Friday, All Souls Day, as we pray for and remember by name all of our parishioners who died this past year (See the insert in

today's bulletin.) *"May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed through the Mercy of God rest in Peace."* May God bless us all.

We are 77% of the way to our goal with only 14% of our parishioners having made a pledge so far. If we can greatly increase that percentage of participation, we have great hope of raising the remaining \$500,000 dollars to reach our goal and accomplish some wonderful things for our Church.

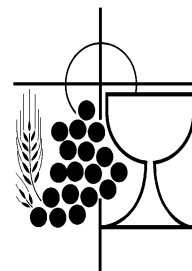
