Dear Parishioners:

Inserted in today's Bulletin is the **Pastor's Annual Report to the Parish**. Please read the report and financial statement carefully and do not hesitate to come to me with any questions or comments you may have.

In preparing my comments, I found myself truly filled with gratitude for all of you and for the tremendous blessing and responsibility entrusted to me in being Pastor of this beautiful Parish. Please know that Father Charles and I are here to serve you and will always make ourselves available to you when you need us. If a loved one is seriously ill or dying, we will come to you any time of day or night. One of our most solemn duties as your Priests is to be available to you and to pray for all of you every day, especially when we offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Let us always pray for each other and work together to take care of our beautiful Parish of Sacred Heart and keep it strong in every way, especially as a Community rich in Faith, Hope, and Love.

We are also grateful as a Country today as we honor our Veterans, those heroic men and women throughout the history of our great Nation who served in our armed forces and fought in wars overseas so heroically, courageously, and selflessly, so that we could live in a Country that is free. All of them were willing to give it all, their very lives, and so many did and continue to do so today. They embody the values of Faith, Family, Country, Service and Sacrifice that made this country great. Let us thank God for the blessing of living in the greatest Country on earth and ask God to bless in a very special way our Veterans and all the men and women of our armed forces today who continue to put their lives on the line every day for our safety and freedom. And Jesus pointed out that this was worth infinitely more than the donations of all the others who were giving out of their surplus wealth. Jesus is teaching us that what is most pleasing to God is not so much the amount we give, but the love that our gift expresses. This poor widow did not give from her left

overs, but gave of her very self, pointing to the Cross where Jesus would give Himself entirely, all the way down to His last drop of blood, out of love for you and for me. When love is sincere, sacrifice comes easily. That is what is most pleasing to God and makes us most like Jesus. May God bless us all.

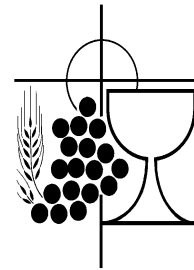
