Sixth Sunday of Easter

Gary Samuel Cuozzo is a spiritual friend in my life, but it was the National Football League that brought us together during my assignment at Our Lady Queen of Peace in Staten Island during the years 2006-2010. Born April 26, 1941 he played quarterback at the University of Virginia before being drafted by the Baltimore Colts in 1963. Born in Montclair, New Jersey he would play not just for the Colts (1963-1966) but also the New Orleans Saints (1967), Minnesota Vikings at the frozen tundra of now-raised (for the Mall of America) Metropolitan Stadium in Bloomington (1968-1971), and the St. Louis Cardinals (1972). I have written about Gary before, so that is enough for his personal life. He has used his platform as a retired player to elevate his relationship with Jesus Christ, weathering the tragedies and obstacles we all face as human beings. He recently emailed me about another former football player, Tim Tebow, who also elevates that platform (like Saint John the Baptist who promoted Jesus not himself as a precursor) during his current efforts to transition to baseball.

Tim Tebow was born on August 14, 1987. He also was a college football quarterback, at the University of Florida where he won the Heisman Trophy in 2007 (meaning basically player-of-the-year). A common visual for football players to deflect the sun is a black tar under the eyes. Most leave the tar in the black color alone, while others punctuate the color with personal messages such as "Mom." Tebow, using his football platform to promote Jesus, interspersed "John 3:16" into his eye tar which raised his national profile in a wholesome way (though he faced much derision, which I believe cut short his football career because of the media reaction and controversy). That passage of the Gospel reads: "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life." Tebow, who is pro-life without any hesitation with regard to the unborn baby, was drafted by the Denver Broncos in 2010 (later played for the New York Jets in 2012). On January 8, 2012 he led the Broncos to a dramatic 29-23 victory in the wildcard playoffs over the Pittsburgh Steelers on the first play of overtime. He had John 3:16 under both eyes. Statistics for Tebow in that playoff game: 316 passing yards for an average of 31.6 per pass completion, running play average of 3.16 when Tebow ran, time of possession for the Broncos in the 60-minute game was 31.06 minutes, and CBS ratings for the game were 31.6. 91 million people Googled John 3:16 during the game. Gary Cuozzo sent this story to me as a reminder of what is important in life: a peaceful relationship with Jesus despite all the life adversities and blessings we each endure and embrace. When we run around like a chicken without its head we lose all of this deep spiritual insight. I stand guilty as charged, often running crazy trying to administrate both Saint Francis of Assisi and Sacred Heart. I need to learn and grow also.

Bethany Mandel writes for a publication called "The Federalist." In a recent column she reflected on the lessons of slowing down we all can learn, during moments when nature strikes such as severe snowstorms. Ponder these words of inspiration: "In this bitter cold snap of weather New Yorkers are facing, let's enjoy the cold instead of just enduring it. Perhaps Norway and Denmark are the happiest countries in the world because of the cold, not despite it...We have something to teach the rest of the world about moving faster, but so too does the world have something to teach us about slowing down... Think sipping hot cocoa next to a roaring fire while reading; think sweatpants and baking; imagine a warm satisfying bowl of soup while you knit." When I look closely at my cats, gerbils, and Moondoggie (all rescued from shelters, streets or pet stores) I see that spiritual peace and unconditional love that Cuozzo and Tebow speak of. Below the surface of our frenzied schedules, which I certainly understand as a pastor, there is that soft spot that God wants us to enter.

A place of faith where comfort, His true peace, deep reflection, courageous strength, and merciful compassion can be entered through prayerfulness and sacramental worship. We pray for such divine graces and cooperate when He sends them to us. As I sip hot "light" cocoa, I am reminded of the fact that Denmark will be seen this September on a parish cruise to Europe that also includes Sweden, Finland, Germany, Estonia, and Russia.
