Feast of the Assumption: Most years we celebrate this feast as a holy day of obligation; however, when August 15th falls on a Saturday or a Monday (as it does this year) our Bishops have determined that attending Mass for this feast is not a matter of obligation for Catholics. As a result, we will have only **one** Mass for the Feast of the Assumption this year: on Saturday, August 15th at 8:00 a.m. There will be no vigil Mass on Friday evening; nor will there be a noon Mass on Saturday. We encourage everyone to honor our Blessed Mother in some way on August 15th – if not by attending Mass, then by praying the rosary that day.

Helping Our A/C: During the summer months we try to keep the church as comfortable as we can. When we have very hot and humid days, that effort is only partially successful. Our church is large, and inevitably, the church doors are opened frequently as people enter and leave the church. We do try to keep our “outside” doors closed – except at the end of Mass, when many parishioners leave together. The doors leading to Yonkers Avenue are usually closed by the ushers, once most parishioners have left the church. The door leading out to St. John’s Avenue from the chapel is usually not staffed by an usher – and some individuals insist on “hooking that door open” – an act of kindness that results in hot air coming into the chapel and the church – and effectively reducing the comfort level in the church. Con Edison gets quite enough from us, without our having to pay to “cool” St. John’s Avenue. Please help!

NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME: Today's liturgy focuses primarily on food – on the human need for food and God's generosity in providing for all human needs. This fundamental physical need becomes the basis for the realization that there is also a fundamental spiritual need for love, meaning, grace – which spiritual need is only satisfied by Jesus, who gives us of His life so that we might live everlastingly.

In today's first reading (Ex. 16:2-15) the Israelites grumble against Moses and Aaron – but their anger is really directed at God; God understands that their hunger has gotten the better of them, so He sends them manna to eat – a miracle which prefigures the even greater miracle of the Eucharist.

Today's gospel (Jn. 6:24-35) begins what may be described as the more specifically “eucharistic” section of the Bread of Life discourse which is the subject of the entire sixth chapter of St. John's gospel. Here, too, the crowd comes looking for physical bread (as did their ancestors in the desert), but Jesus begins to teach them about a different kind of bread – the bread from heaven that gives life to the world.

In the second reading (Eph. 4:17-24) St. Paul reflects on the “new-ness” of Christ and insists that since we have been made new in Him, we must put aside our old ways of thinking and acting.



SPECIAL SAINTS' DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, August 10th – St. Lawrence

A deacon in the Church in Rome in the third century, Lawrence is said to have been responsible for caring for the poor. He was martyred for the faith during the persecution of the Emperor Valerian. It is said that Lawrence's courage so infuriated his persecutors that they ordered him to suffer the painful death of being burned over hot coals on a white hot gridiron.

Tuesday, August 11th – St. Clare

As a teenager, Clare was deeply moved by the preaching of another citizen of her native Assisi – St. Francis. The two became friends and Clare decided to live the gospel as literally and fully as Francis did. In time she founded an order of nuns (Poor Clares) and because of her reputation for holiness and wisdom she became the counselor of bishops, cardinals – and even the Pope himself! St. Clare died in 1253 at the age of fifty-nine.

Wednesday, August 12th – St. Frances de Chantal

Wife and mother of seven, Jane lived in France in the early seventeenth century. After her husband died, she asked the great St. Francis de Sales to be her spiritual director. She spent the last years of her life caring for the sick and eventually founded a religious order, the Visitation Sisters.

Thursday, August 13th – Sts. Pontian and Hippolytus

In the 3rd century, the Roman persecution of the early Church was fierce – many Christians were jailed, exiled, tortured, and put to death. Pontian was a pope who died in 235; Hippolytus was a priest and theologian who died the same year.

Friday, August 14th – St. Maximilian Kolbe

Fr. Kolbe was born in Poland in 1894; he entered the Franciscan Order and after his ordination he first taught in Poland, then did missionary work in Japan and India. He was recalled to Poland shortly before the Germans invaded in 1939. As a leader in the Catholic resistance, Kolbe was imprisoned in Auschwitz. When the Nazi guards of the camp decided to execute 10 prisoners as an example to the others, Kolbe asked to take the place of a married man with a family. He was killed on August 14, 1941.

Saturday, August 15th – Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Today, together with the whole Church, we honor Mary – not just because she was the mother of God, but because by her faith, courage, and total dedication to God's will, she is the model for and mother of all believers. Today's feast is also an important reminder of the innate goodness of the human person. Due in part to the influence of Greek philosophy, some Christian thinkers in the early centuries of the Church became increasingly uncomfortable with the physical side of our human nature. The body came to be regarded as an impediment to a truly holy life; only our spiritual dimension was worthy of our call to perfection as children of God. Unfortunately, we still often deal with aspects of that kind of thinking. Mary's Assumption goes a long way toward rebalancing these tilted scales. Mary could not have lived out her spiritual commitment without the involvement of her physical body. Therefore her entire being, body and soul, was taken to heaven. Her body was fittingly spared the corruption of the grave. The God of Genesis declares that all creation is decidedly good. The summit of that creation is the human person – made in God's image. It is only right, therefore, that we celebrate a feast honoring Mary's complete personhood. By so doing we are celebrating the goodness of all humanity.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (popularly known as "RCIA") is the process designed by the Church for

adults to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and First Communion. The goals are to give a complete overview of Catholic teaching and practice and to begin to deepen a Christian spiritual life centered in the Sunday Scripture readings. The sacraments are received at the Easter Vigil Mass.

It is open to adults who:

- Have never been baptized; they would be preparing for all three sacraments.
- Were baptized in a non-Catholic Christian denomination who are interested in becoming Catholic; they would be preparing for Confirmation and First Communion.
- Were baptized Catholic but never received Confirmation and/or Communion; they would be preparing for the sacraments they have not yet received.
