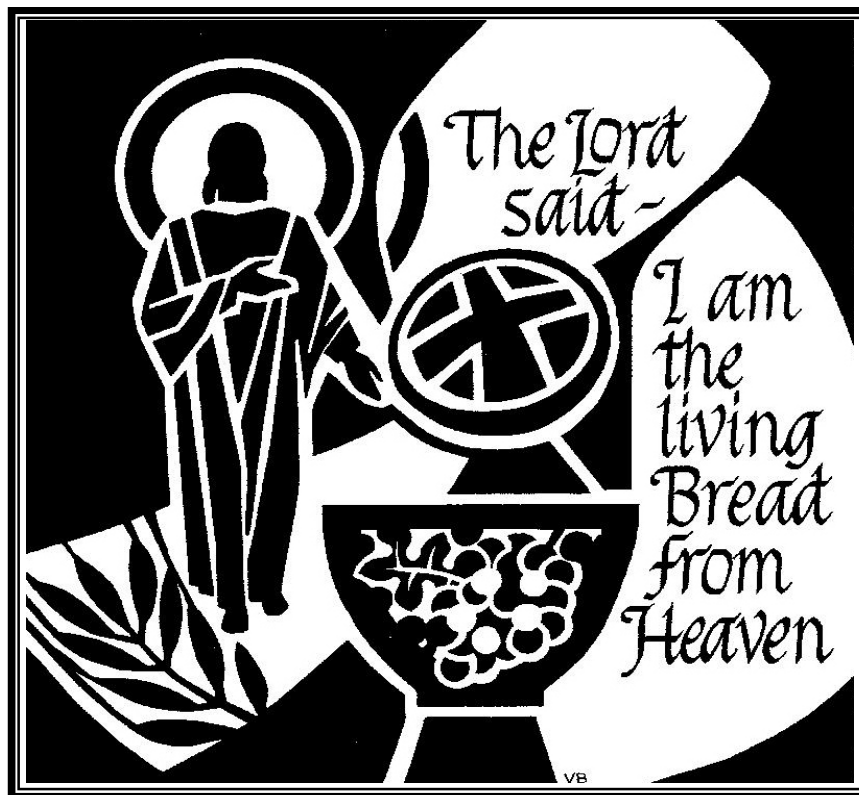

June 18, 2017

FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI: The origin of this feast (now celebrated as the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ) is traced to the special devotion to the Blessed Sacrament that developed during the twelfth century. At that time to combat certain ideas that had arisen about the Eucharist, special emphasis was placed on the real presence of Christ “whole and entire under the forms of bread and wine”. The celebration of the feast which began in France quickly spread until Pope Urban IV extended the feast to the entire church in 1264. It has remained part of the Church’s calendar and an integral part of Catholic devotion ever since. It is both fitting and proper for the Church to set aside a special day to honor our Blessed Lord in the Eucharist and to give thanks for this permanent memorial of His life-giving love for us.

Today’s feast invites us to look more closely at what we do and who we are as the Body of Christ. We might consider this Sunday a call to look at the real necessities of life. The readings today remind us of the importance of bread as a source of nourishment, a necessity of life. For the Israelites in our first reading from the Old Testament’s Book of Deuteronomy (Dt. 8:2-16) daily manna from heaven meant survival. For the first century Christians, the breaking of bread and table fellowship meant spiritual survival, eternal life. For us today, the Word of God that calls us to action, that transforms our life, and the Eucharist that nourishes us in faith, are vital necessities for both our human life and eternal life together.

In his message to the Corinthians and to us in today’s second reading (1Cor. 10:16-17), St. Paul reminds us of the responsibility that goes with Baptism in Christ Jesus. The Eucharist is the sacrament of unity, but it is also a sacrament of commitment. We are aware that to share the one bread, as we read in Paul’s letter today, is to become one body, one People of God, called to go forth to love and serve.

SPECIAL SAINTS’ DAYS THIS WEEK

Monday, June 19th – St. Romuald

Born of an Italian noble family in Ravenna in the middle of the 10th century, Romuald entered a Benedictine monastery where he later became an abbot. He established hermitages and monasteries throughout central and northern Italy and promoted contemplative prayer in a life of solitude, silence, and fasting. He died around 1027.

Wednesday, June 21st – St. Aloysius Gonzaga

This Jesuit seminarian ministered to victims of the plague and contracted the disease himself in 1591. His early death and life-long innocence caused many in past years to propose him as a patron of youth. Now an increasing number of Jesuits and health care workers would like to see him declared the patron of those with AIDS. We can at least use his memorial as an opportunity to pray for young people and for those living with AIDS.

Thursday, June 22nd – St. John Fisher and St. Thomas More

These two English saints (John a Bishop and Chancellor of Cambridge University; Thomas a husband and father and Lord Chancellor of England) lived in the 16th century England when Henry VIII ruled as king. He ordered John and Thomas to be executed because they refused to accept his divorce and his claim to be head of the Church of England. They are martyrs for the integrity of the Sacrament of Matrimony and the divine origin of the Petrine ministry exercised by our popes. We need the prayer and witness of these good saints again as we struggle to preserve marriage and support the authority of the Holy Father.

Friday, June 23rd -- The Sacred Heart of Jesus

This feast, celebrated every year on the Friday after the Feast of Corpus Christi, has strong ties to the Passion of Christ which is also celebrated on a Friday. The heart is the traditional symbol for love, tenderness and care. Those same attributes are embodied in the ancient near eastern shepherd who knows his sheep and treats them with tenderness and care. Jesus is that shepherd willing to take the extravagant risk of leaving the 99 to find the one lost sheep. He brings this image to life in His death and resurrection, reconciling God’s people. As we journey through life, his tender compassion sustains us.

Saturday, June 24th – Nativity of St. John the Baptist

Two solemnities celebrated at the end of June, the Nativity of John the Baptist and Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, are mentioned in the most ancient liturgical texts preserved for the city of Rome. John the Baptist is seen as the last of a long line of prophets who proclaimed the coming of ultimate revelation of God in Jesus Christ. Celebrated at the time of the summer solstice (in contrast with the celebration of Christmas near the winter solstice), St. Augustine saw in this date a cosmic confirmation of John’s words: “He must increase, but I must decrease” (John 3:30). The stories of John in the Scriptures speak of one who calls the people of Israel to repentance in order to be ready for salvation in Christ. Today’s celebration can be the occasion for us to reflect on the power of announcement embodied in his life. For every Christian, the call is to repent and believe and proclaim the power of Christ’s victory over sin and death.
