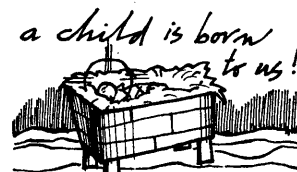

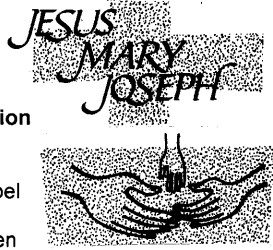

Advent Holy Hour \ Sacrament of Reconciliation: On Sunday December 23, at St Anthony, Hospers, there will be a Holy Hour and an opportunity for Sacramental Confession. Beginning at 1:30 pm, the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed, followed by silent adoration. During the time of adoration, a priest will be available for individual confessions. Benediction will take place at 2:20 pm. If there are more confessions to be heard after Benediction, the priest will be available until all are heard.

Christmas Procession: Elementary age (6th grade and below) children are invited to join in the entrance procession at the beginning of the Christmas Eve Masses in the respective parishes. April 2018 First Communicants (who will carry baby Jesus) please be in the back of church 10 minutes prior to the start of Mass. Others will be invited to join right before Mass begins and will be asked to return to parents after procession.

Catholic Charities of the Diocese of Sioux City works every day to give spiritual and material support to Christ's little ones. Catholic Charities is an arm of the Church, dedicated to helping the poor, especially those suffering from mental illness, substance abuse, family issues, and other psychological and spiritual poverties. But they also need your help to continue the ministry and good work they do. *The collection for Catholic Charities will be collected at all Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses. Kindly use the envelope from your packet and place in the normal collection.* Thank you for your support. If you did not bring to the Christmas Mass and you still wish to contribute, place your envelope, marked Catholic Charities, in the regular collection at Mass.

Holy Communion \ Exchange of Peace at Mass: Due to increase of cold and flu during these winter months, Holy Communion will be offered only under the form of Sacred Bread. As to the ministry of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, when Deacon Dan is present, one EMHC will be scheduled to assist at Mass; when Deacon is not present, two EMHCs will be scheduled to help with distribution of the Sacred Host. Until further notice, we will also refrain from exchanging the sign of peace. This will go into effect the weekend of December 29/30.

Tuesday, Jan 1, 2019 is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. It is a holy day of obligation. Note there will be two vigil (New Year's Eve) Masses, and one Mass on New Year's, the day of the solemnity. The times will be:

Monday, December 31 (New Year's Eve) --- 6:00 pm @ Alton
Tuesday, January 1 (New Year's Day) --- 9:00 am @ Granville



New Year Hour of Prayer: After the 9 am Mass at Granville on New Year's Day, there will be exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by a Scriptural Rosary and silent adoration. Benediction will take place at 10:30 am. Join in all or part of this time praying in a special way for peace in the new year.
