Saturday afternoons 4:30 to 5:15 pm, and anytime at the Rectory.

MARRIAGES:

Arrangements should be made at least six months in advance at the rectory to ensure the date and the hour desired. The Nuptial Mass is the ordinary form of celebrating Christian marriage, and should be strongly considered when making Wedding plans. Attendance at the Pre-Cana Conferences, or the equivalent, is required by the Archbishop.

PARISH BOUNDARIES:

Central Park West to the Hudson River, from the South side of 77th Street down to the North side of 65th Street.

NEW PARISHIONERS:

We welcome new parishioners, and invite them to register at the Rectory. The registration is our only means of certifying anyone as a member of our parish. If you move to another Parish, or change your address within the Parish, please notify us.

FATIMA DEVOTIONS:

The Rosary is said daily after the 12:10 pm Mass. Friday from 6-7 pm there is a holy hour.

BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT:

First Friday - Exposition: 12:35 pm.
Adoration: All day; Benediction: 5:15 PM.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA:

Mondays, before the 12:10 Mass and before the 5:30 pm Mass.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION FOR CHILDREN AND TEENAGERS:

Classes in Religion for Catholic children/teenagers, Pre-kindergarten - High School take place on Sundays. The Family Mass begins at 10:00 a.m. in the Church followed by class instruction in the school.

Ongoing religious education is important for the religious development of your children. First Communion and Confirmation require a two year program.

We worship this weekend with an eye towards July 4, Independence Day, when our Forefathers rejected tyranny and stated:

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the pursuit of Happiness.- That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed,-

As we mark our Independence, I urge you to read the whole document. On Wednesday, Independence Day, there will be one Mass in the Parish, offered at 12:10pm, and the Church will remain open from 7am-3pm for personal prayer; the Rectory will be open from 10am-2pm. If you are in the city please come, if not, let us remain with each other in spirit as we pray for our country in these difficult times.

A note came asking that confessions be heard one other day than Saturday- I have asked a few people- no one can decide on a day- but then the thought struck me that we hear confessions almost every day in the Rectory- all one need do is simply come and make sure a priest is here- simply call- if you want anonymity you can be met in the confessional box- I hope this will satisfy the need.

Baptism preparation will be held on Tuesday evening July 3rd at 7:30 PM in the second floor of the rectory.

Please take a look at the most current Financial Report here in the Bulletin, which we are happy to publish as the summer gets underway.

I hope you are enjoying the summer....I urge you to not forget Mass every single Sunday which is our responsibility as believers- it is important to sit under the Word that challenges us to ask if we have been faithful...and then to be nourished with the Eucharist, the food God offers us, to strengthen us in our efforts to be faithful.

It is the summer time- comfortable summer clothing is most appropriate in Church during these days of heat and humidity.

Tuesday is the Feast of St. Thomas the Apostle, who needed to see in order to believe. Each of us journeys with God as we are, challenged and inspired to grow into deeper faith and trust. Thomas' doubt would eventually transform into zeal, and is considered the only Apostle to evangelize outside the Roman Empire, where Tradition holds he evangelized the peoples of Kerala, India. Friday is the Feast of St. Maria Goretti, one of the youngest Saints to be canonized. Murdered by a neighbor, Alessandro Serenelli, for questioning his sexual advances towards her, Maria forgave her murderer before she died. Upon

his release from jail, Alessandro returned to Maria's mother to ask pardon...he would eventually become a Capuchin lay brother and was present at Maria's canonization.

Friday is First Friday...please join us for Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament from 1pm-5:30pm.

Empezamos este fin de semana con la vista puesta en el 4 de julio, Día de la Independencia, cuando nuestros antepasados rechazaron la tiranía y declararon:

Sostenemos que estas verdades son evidentes por sí mismas, que todos los hombres son creados iguales, que están dotados por su Creador de ciertos derechos inalienables, que entre ellos están la Vida, la Libertad y la Búsqueda de la Felicidad. Que para asegurar estos derechos, los gobiernos se instituyen entre los hombres, derivando sus justos poderes del consentimiento de los gobernados, -

Cuando marcamos nuestra Independencia, les pido leer todo el documento. El miércoles, Día de la Independencia, habrá una Misa en la Parroquia, que se ofrecerá a las 12:10 p.m., y la Iglesia permanecerá abierta de 7:00 a.m. a 3:00 p.m. para la oración personal; la rectoría estará abierta de 10:00 a.m. a 2:00 p.m. Si estás en la ciudad, por favor ven, si no, vamos a permanecer con los demás en espíritu mientras oramos por nuestro país.

Me llegó una nota pidiendo que las confesiones se oyeran otro día que no sea el sábado. He preguntado a algunas personas, nadie se decide por un día, pero luego pensé que escuchamos confesiones casi todos los días en la Rectoría; lo que deben hacer es venir y asegurarse que aquí haya un sacerdote. Simplemente llamen, y si quieren ser anónimos, se les puede encontrar en el confesionario. Espero que esto satisfaga esta necesidad.

La preparación para el bautismo se llevará a cabo el martes 3 de julio a las 7:30 p.m. en el segundo piso de la rectoría.

Espero que estén disfrutando el verano ... Los insto a que no olviden misa todos los domingos, que es nuestra responsabilidad como creyentes, es importante sentarse bajo la Palabra que nos desafía a preguntar si hemos sido fieles ... y luego nutrirse de la Eucaristía, la comida que Dios nos ofrece, para fortalecernos en nuestros esfuerzos por ser fieles.

Es el horario de verano: la ropa cómoda de verano es la más apropiada en la Iglesia durante estos días de calor y humedad.

Les pido leer aquí en el Boletín el Informe financiero más reciente, el cual nos complace publicar a medida que se acerca el verano.

El martes es la fiesta de Santo Tomás Apóstol, quien necesitaba ver para creer. Cada uno de nosotros viaja con Dios tal como es, desafiado e inspirado para crecer en una fe y confianza más profundas. La duda de Tomás eventualmente se transformaría en celo, y es considerado el único apóstol para evangelizar fuera del Imperio Romano, donde la tradición sostiene que evangelizó a los pueblos de Kerala, India. El viernes es la fiesta de Santa María Goretti, una de las santas más jóvenes en ser canonizada. Asesinado por un vecino, Alessandro Serenelli, por cuestionar sus avances sexuales hacia ella, María perdonó a su asesino antes de morir. Tras su liberación de la cárcel, Alessandro regresó donde la madre de María para pedirle perdón ... eventualmente se convertiría en un hermano laico capuchino y estuvo presente en la canonización de María.

El viernes es Viernes Primero ... por favor únanse a nosotros para la Adoración del Santísimo Sacramento de 1:00 p.m. a 5:30 p.m.

Current Year to Date Financial Report

Financial transparency is essential to the life of any organization, and the Church is no exception. I am grateful that the members of the Finance Council see this a priority for us here at Blessed Sacrament, especially because we are such a large and active parish, with many resources, but also many needs. I am happy to present to you our most current year to date Financial Report. Our Fiscal Year runs from September through August, and this coming Fall we will begin presenting quarterly reports to the parish, as I promised last Fall.

From September 1, 2017 – April 30, 2018, our regular collection totals are up from last year thanks to your continued generosity. As you know we have been encouraging parishioners to sign up for *WeShare* to help stabilize the offertory. In our 2015 Parish Survey we learned that 40% of our parishioners attend Mass once monthly. Each week I preach the importance of weekly Mass attendance so that the Word of God can challenge and inspire us, and so that we can receive strength from the Eucharist, but each of us journeys with the Lord as we are and as we are able. Supporting the parish community as we make that journey in sincerity is, I believe, a sign of our goodness and participation in the life of the Church.

The surplus we are currently running in our Operating Budget is also thanks to the work and generosity of many over and above their weekly giving. I must point out that our Year End Operational Appeal, which we hope to continue each year, raised \$154,352.20. The remaining \$109,000 raised through our fundraising efforts includes our theatre and other space rentals as well as the *Moving with the Spirit* event, which last year raised funds for the Poor Box, and this year raised funds to continue upgrading the theatre so that it can continue to assist the parish as a means of revenue.

All of what I just addressed regards the daily operations here, i.e. keeping Blessed Sacrament going while making regular maintenance and necessary upgrades a priority along the way. We must, however, also recognize the great need for capital improvements, some of which are already underway. The Façade work is slated to finish this fall and every person giving to the 5 Year Capital Campaign is making this a reality. Other capital improvements we are now preparing to accept and plan for. The parish currently awaits a finalized Facility Assessment Report, conducted in the spring, which will give us a sense of immediate and eventual needs to our electrical, mechanical, plumbing, and fire safety systems. We are indebted to the parish Buildings and Grounds Committee for making this a priority. **While we await those findings, we already know we need the following capital work performed:** modernization of our 3 elevators because of code changes, structural work to at least the sidewalk vault on 70th street, major electrical equipment replacements in the church and school as well as replacing the lighting system in the church itself, addressing the church's failing pipe organ.

It is a joy and an honor to have been asked to help shepherd the community here at Blessed Sacrament, and it is a privilege to work alongside some very talented people both pastorally and administratively. I would like to thank each of you once again for your support and again to the Finance Council for their ardent desire to keep us financially sound and prepared for the present needs we are facing.

Informe Financiero Actualizado

La transparencia financiera es esencial para la vida de cualquier organización, y la Iglesia no es una excepción. Estoy agradecido de que los miembros del Consejo de Finanzas vean esto como una prioridad para nosotros aquí en “Blessed Sacrament”, especialmente porque somos una parroquia grande y activa, con muchos recursos, pero también muchas necesidades. Me complace presentarles nuestro informe financiero más reciente. Nuestro año fiscal se extiende de septiembre a agosto, y este próximo otoño comenzaremos a presentar informes trimestrales a la parroquia, como les prometí el otoño pasado.

Desde el 1 de septiembre de 2017 hasta el 30 de abril de 2018, nuestros totales regulares de recaudación aumentaron con respecto al año anterior gracias a su continua generosidad. Como saben, hemos estado alentando a los feligreses a inscribirse en “WeShare” para ayudar a estabilizar el ofertorio. Por nuestra Encuesta Parroquial de 2015 notamos que el 40% de nuestros feligreses asisten a Misa una vez al mes. Cada semana predico la importancia de la asistencia a la Misa semanal para que la Palabra de Dios pueda desafiarnos e inspirarnos, y para que podamos recibir fuerza de la Eucaristía, pero cada uno de nosotros camina con el Señor según somos y como podemos. Apoyar a la comunidad parroquial mientras hacemos ese viaje con sinceridad es, creo yo, un signo de nuestra bondad y participación en la vida de la Iglesia.

El superávit que estamos administrando actualmente en nuestro presupuesto operativo también se debe al trabajo y la generosidad de muchos, además de sus donaciones semanales. Debo señalar que nuestra Apelación Operacional de Fin de Año, que esperamos continuar cada año, recaudó \$154,352.20. Los \$109,000 restantes lo conseguimos a través de nuestros esfuerzos de recaudación de fondos e incluyen nuestro teatro y otros alquileres de espacio, así como el evento “Moving with the Spirit”, que el año pasado recaudó fondos para nuestro “Poor Box”, y este año recaudó fondos para mejoras al teatro para que el mismo pueda continuar como fuente de ingresos para nuestra parroquia.

Todo lo que acabo de mencionar se refiere a las operaciones diarias de aquí, es decir, mantener a “Blessed Sacrament” en marcha, mientras que el mantenimiento regular y las actualizaciones necesarias son una prioridad en el futuro. Sin embargo, también debemos reconocer la gran necesidad de mejoras de capital, algunas de las cuales ya están en marcha. El trabajo de la Fachada deberá finalizar este otoño y cada persona que participa en la Campaña Capital de 5 años está haciendo esto una realidad. Estamos ahora preparando y planificando otras mejoras de capital. La parroquia actualmente espera un Informe final de evaluación de nuestras instalaciones realizado en la primavera, que nos dará una idea de las necesidades inmediatas y eventuales de nuestros sistemas eléctricos, mecánicos, de plomería y de seguridad contra incendios. Estamos en deuda con el Comité de Edificios y Terrenos de la parroquia por hacer de esto una prioridad. **Mientras esperamos estos resultados, ya sabemos que necesitamos realizar los trabajos siguientes:** modernización de nuestros 3 ascensores debido a cambios de código, trabajo estructural al menos en la bóveda de la acera en la calle 70, reemplazos mayores de equipos eléctricos en la iglesia y la escuela así como el reemplazo del sistema de iluminación dentro de la iglesia, dirigiéndose al órgano de la iglesia que falla.

Es un placer y un honor haber sido invitado a ayudar a encaminar la comunidad de “Blessed Sacrament”, y es un privilegio trabajar junto a personas de talento tanto en lo pastoral como en lo administrativo. Quisiera agradecer nuevamente a cada uno de ustedes su apoyo y nuevamente al Consejo de Finanzas su ardiente deseo de mantenernos sanos y preparados para las necesidades a las cuales nos enfrentamos.
