#### Reflections for the Twenty Sirst Sunday in Ordinary Time



For our Gospel today we hear the conclusion of the "Bread of Life discourse". In the preceding verses over the past few weeks, we have heard Jesus explain that he is the Bread of Life, given so that those who believe may have eternal life. This discourse follows the

miracle in which Jesus fed more than five thousand people with five barley loaves and two fish. Today's Gospel first records the response of those in the crowd who are described as Jesus' disciples. Just as the larger crowd had struggled with Jesus' teaching, these disciples also cannot accept Jesus' words. Jesus is said to know about their murmuring. He responds by acknowledging their unbelief and by reiterating that only those chosen by the Father will follow Jesus to the end. John's Gospel reports that many of those who had been Jesus' disciples ceased to follow him at this point. The number of people following Jesus dwindled from a crowd of more than 5,000 to only 12 people. And it is to these Twelve that Jesus now turns his attention.

Simon Peter's response to Jesus' question as to whether those closest to him will also leave, reminds us of the reports of Peter's confession of faith in the Synoptic Gospels. Peter announces, on behalf of all the Twelve, that they have come to believe all that Jesus has taught about himself: Jesus is the one from God in whom they have found the path to eternal life.

This conclusion of the Bread of Life discourse focuses on personal faith in the life of Christian discipleship. Each person must make his or her own judgment about who Jesus is and in doing so determine the way of life that he or she will follow. God's grace invites us to be Jesus' disciples, but each person must respond to the grace of God and confess as his or her own the belief that Jesus is the one from God. This faith then commits us to the path of life, leading us to eternal life.

Almost every day when he is in Rome, Pope Francis leads the faithful in the Angelus, an ancient devotion commemorating the Incarnation (the actual name of the event in which Jesus came among us as a man, which we commonly call Christmas). In preparation for the Year of Mercy, which will begin on December 8, 2015, the Holy Father recently dedicated his words for the Angelus to inviting frequent and joyful reception of the sacrament of Reconciliation, also known as Confession and Penance.

He called upon this gift of God as "a strong call to draw close to the Lord in [this] sacrament of mercy and also to receive Communion." He went to recognize that there are people "who are afraid of approaching confession." He said this is because they forget that there, "we do not find a severe judge, but rather the immensely merciful Father." "It's true that when we go to the confessional," Francis said, "we feel a bit of embarrassment, and that happens to everyone, to all of us, but we have to recall that this shame is also a grace that prepares us for the embrace of the Father, who always forgives and always forgives everything."

How interesting it is to find lines for Communion to be so long while the lines for Confession are so short! How quickly in our rush to experience God's love – which we certainly do in the Eucharist – do we forget the exhortation of St. Paul to the community at Corinth: "For he that eats and drinks unworthily, eats and drinks judgment to himself" (1 Cor. 11:29). This means that as Catholics participating in the Eucharist we are to be in a "state of grace". That means that we conscious of having no serious sin on our souls.

If this is the case, we are supposed to be sacramentally reconciled to God prior to receiving Communion. The Church teaches that we must celebrate Confession at least once a year or when we have committed serious (the old term, which says it more appropriately, is "mortal") sin (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 1457.)

How long has it been since you've met Christ the Healer in the sacrament of Reconciliation? Pope Francis has made it clear that in the confessional that's who we are speaking with: a God who only needs to hear our sincere contrition to take us back fully into His friendship. If it has been a while, come and celebrate the sacrament again – He is waiting for you with open arms.

#### WHY DO WE DISMISS THE CATECHUMENS?

At Visitation we dismiss our Catechumens after the homily but before the Creed. While it may seem inhospitable, it is actually enabling them to complete their job in the RCIA. We are not sending the catechumens away because they are unworthy, or because we don't want to reveal the next portion of the Mass to them, we are sending them out to do the work that is appropriate to their order in the Body of Christ. Their vocation is to hear the Word of God and act on it. When we send them forth they consume the word of God in their dismissal session. They focus intently, listen deeply to the Word, and how they can use it to lead a purer life. This is an essential part of their training in the Christian life. The dismissal is not a time for actual teaching, it is a time for reflection, prayer, and faith sharing that flows from God's Word. The leader does not need to be a catechist they only need to be someone who reflects on their own faith. Someone who can use the scripture to form their life.
