Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Parents and Guardians are required and sponsors are encouraged to attend the Baptismal Formation Session prior to the Baptism. Baptisms are celebrated on Sundays following the 12:30 Mass at 1:45 PM. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

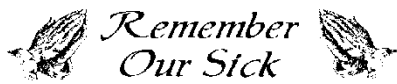

Reflections for

The Fifth Sunday in Ordinary time

In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches from Simon's boat. Jesus turns to Simon and instructs him about where to lower the fishing nets. Simon and others have been fishing throughout the night and have not caught anything. Simon protests, claiming that such an effort would be futile. Simon ultimately obeys Jesus and lowers his nets into the deeper water as directed. Notice here that Peter calls Jesus by the title "master." He already recognizes Jesus as a person of authority. They catch so many fish that the nets begin to tear; Jesus' presence has created abundance out of scarcity, just as it did at the wedding feast at Cana, which we heard at Mass just a few weeks ago.

Simon Peter becomes a follower of Jesus immediately. He calls Jesus "Lord"—the title given to Jesus after his Resurrection—and protests his worthiness to be in Jesus' presence. Today's Gospel, therefore, marks a turning point in the relationship between Jesus and Peter.

Two of Simon's partners are also named as witnesses to the event described in today's Gospel: Zebedee's sons, James and John. Yet Jesus' words are addressed only to Simon. Jesus gives Simon a new job, telling him that he will become a different kind of fisherman. No longer will he catch fish; instead he will catch people. In these words, we hear the beginning of the leadership role that Peter will have within the community of disciples. Peter was chosen for this role. His task will be to bring others to Jesus. Already he is doing so; the Gospel tells us that all the fishermen with Peter also left their nets and followed Jesus.

We continue to speak of Peter's leadership and influence in the Church today when we call the pope the "successor of Peter." We participate in the mission of the Church when we bring people to Christ through the example and positive influence of our lives. *Loyola Press*

FROM THE DESK OF
Fr. Jim O'Neill

Dear Parishioners,

I'm writing this on the Feast of the Presentation, February 2nd. Mary and Joseph presented Jesus in the Temple. Simeon recognized him as light to the Gentiles and glory for Israel. In today's first reading from Isaiah, we hear about Isaiah's vision of the Lord whose glory fills the earth. Isaiah is terrified that he will die from fright at having seen the glorious Lord.

Yet, we know that Jesus wants us to see him, to experience the fullness of his glory in Heaven. What are some of the ways that God prepares us to receive Him who is Love?

In nature, we experience light and dark. Today, 2/2, the sun is shining quite pleasantly. Yet, there's a distance to the sunlight. It's not like high noon on 6/21. Tomorrow, 2/3, we're expecting darkness with April like showers. This won't be a despairing darkness because we hope it will wash away the snow.

These natural experiences of light and dark can help us understand greater realities of light and dark in the spiritual life. We experience darkness when we sin, saying no to God. We experience light when we repent and receive his mercy. When we are new in the spiritual life, the light of Christ is quite pleasant and does not overwhelm us. As we grow closer to Him, we recognize a growing intensity of the light.

When advanced in the spiritual life, we sometimes experience darkness. We wonder what we've done wrong, what sins we've committed. Yet, we might not have sinned even in the slightest. God might be using the darkness to purify us of even our attachments so that we become spiritually married to Him as members of the Bride of Christ, the Church. Or we might be immersed in such light that our spiritual eyes can't take it in. It's like emerging from a dark cave into wonderful light. It takes time for our eyes to adjust.

As Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, we have an opportunity to freely enter a purifying darkness. We can fast from some good thing like ice cream or make some kind of sacrifice. We can enter a spiritual desert in order to allow the Lord to purify us from our unhealthy attachments. After this time of purification, we will be more ready, more attuned to seeing the Light of Christ at the celebration of His Resurrection!

Suggestions for a Meaningful Lent

Lent is a time of prayer, penance and sacrifice, a time for the family of God to be more attentive to the words of Jesus and to each other.

It is a time to try harder to put Christ's teachings into practice; to make a concentrated effort toward the springtime of spiritual growth, or rebirth and renewal. It is 6 weeks of Retreat. It is a 40-day journey with Jesus. Lent means doing something as well as giving up something.

Here are some things you may want to think about to enhance your 40 day journey:

Hope and Lent –

The Sacrament of Reconciliation can be an open door to holiness

Signs of Love for Lent –

Practice the 3 C's – give 3 compliments a day to your spouse, your child or to someone else.

Remove something from your calendar and spend that time with your family.

Blessing -

Parents, bless your children by making the sign of the cross on their forehead before they go to bed at night or when they leave for school each day. Recall your blessings each night before sleep.

Clay Pot -

Shatter an inexpensive clay pot and give each family member a piece to keep during Lent as a reminder that we are like clay in God's hands. During Lent, we can allow God to shape us into new vessels.

Fasting during Lent -

Fast from fast food

Fast from TV one day a week

Fast from electronic games one day a week.

Fast from using the computer and spend that time with your family.

Fast from buying anything that is unnecessary during Lent.

Fast from bad habits that need to be changed/given up.

Plan a simple meal -

A yummy meatless dish.

Talk about ways to help the hungry at your table

Family –

Schedule a Family Night. Plan time together and enrich your family life.

Share these ideas and ask God to help you carry out one of them.

LENT INSTRUCTION

The days of **fast and abstinence** are **ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY**.

The other **Fridays of Lent** are **DAYS OF ABSTINENCE**.

Those between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine are obliged to fast. By this obligation, the individual is permitted only one full meal a day.

At the age of fourteen, people are obliged to abstain. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Missing abstinence on any one (1) Friday is not a serious sin. Missing abstinence most of the Fridays of Lent (or more than half of them) is a serious sin that needs to be confessed & absolved.

The obligation of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 22, to Trinity Sunday, May 31**. However, the Code of Canon Law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

ADULTS and TEENS who wish to receive the **Sacrament of Confirmation**, sessions are now forming. Confirmation, like baptism, is a sacrament of initiation into the Christian life. It is a sacrament that Jesus Christ instituted within his Catholic Church to further strengthen those who have reached adulthood.

To receive the sacrament it is required that you have received Baptism and Holy Communion in the Catholic Church. You should be an active Catholic and, if married, your marriage should be in accordance with the laws of the Church.

Orientation and registration will be on Friday, February 12, 2016 at 7:00 PM in the Daily Chapel. There are 11 instruction weeks, 1 Retreat, 1 practice session and Confirmation Day. RCIA CORNER

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent for us Catholics this week. Forty days of fasting and abstinence prepare us for the great Holy Week and the Resurrection of Our Lord. The word sacrifice comes from the English word – to offer. To sacrifice means serve God and offer sacrifice-zealously. We should find different ways to sacrifice during Lent to show our love for what God has done for us.

During Lent – we fast and abstain. On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, we have only one full meal a day and abstain from eating meat. On the other Fridays of Lent, we the faithful, also go without eating meat. Remember prayer is part of our sacrifice and remembering that Jesus sacrificed so much for us that we are willing to do without for him.

We are encouraged "to give up something" for Lent as a part of our sacrifice. However, on Sundays and solemnities like St. Joseph's Day (March 19), one can partake of whatever has been offered up for Lent. Praying and remembering also plays an important part in this portion of our sacrifice.

From our reading from the Book of Joel on Ash Wednesday we hear “rend your hearts, not your garments, and return to the Lord your God.” Joel is calling upon the people to repent and return to their God. This is a call that is extended to us too, and to all. Let us find ways to love more and revisit our spiritual exercises.

Paul’s second letter to the Corinthians shows us why we reform our lives as presented by Joel. Jesus took our sins by his death on the cross, so that we might “become the very holiness of God.” Now is the day of Salvation!

Our gospel tells us about sacrifice - almsgiving, prayer and fasting. Three things we must concentrate on during Lent. These practices will enable us to enter into a deeper walk with him.

We have one Catechumen who is getting ready for her journey to the Easter Sacraments. Next Sunday, February 14, 2016, we will celebrate the Rite of Sending with her. She will take part in the rite in which she will write her name in the book of life and then our Bishop will recognize her as being elected by God for full entry into the Catholic faith. Please keep Nicole Rita Kindnersky in your prayers as we journey with her as her community of faith.

FEBRUARY 7, 2016

SMUDGED WITH ASHES, SMEARED WITH OIL

On a somber Wednesday (February 10) we will gather to smudge every forehead with ashes, admonishing each other to remember that dust returns to dust and that the only way through death to life is Christ. The ashes are made by burning palms—given to us on Passion Sunday a year ago with the invitation to “go forth in peace, praising Jesus our Messiah, as did the crowds that welcomed him into Jerusalem.” Our baptismal life is a lifelong pilgrimage with Christ toward Jerusalem. Yet like our best intentions, last year’s palm branches now have become dried and brittle—fodder for the fire. So our pilgrimage leads us to Lent. And a hostile climate of sin and suffering necessitates drastic measures: We are marked with ashes as a sign of our willingness to pray, fast and give alms.

But this gritty smudge that we accept on our foreheads is not a death sentence. It is not the mark of Cain. A reminder of our fragile mortality, it is nonetheless shaped in the great sign of salvation: The ashes form a cross, a thumb-printed cross that marks the same heads that were smeared with chrism at baptism. Anointed with that royal oil, we are committed to conversion, to continually setting out for the New Jerusalem, to leaving behind forever our captivity in Egypt.

This gritty ashen sign reminds us that on the way there is soil and toil, sweat and hard work before we come to the oasis in this desert—the Easter bath of baptism. At the font, on a damp and chilly night, water will wash away soil and oil will soothe away toil to make new Christians royal: heirs of the reign of God. The dusty smudges will be gone, and in the light of the paschal candle the oily heads of the newly baptized will shine like the moon and the stars, reminding us of our destiny. What begins in ashes ends in water and in fire.

This is a wonderful opportunity to spend some time in the presence of God and experience the depth of the Lenten Season. The prayers used in this encounter help us connect Christ's last steps on this earth to our own daily lives
