Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. The Fifth Sunday in Lent

Today's Gospel begins by reporting that Jesus is again teaching the crowds in the vicinity of the Temple. The scribes and the Pharisees approach Jesus, bringing a woman who has been caught in the act of adultery. They put to Jesus the question of what ought to be done in this case.

The Pharisees state clearly that according to the Law of Moses, those caught in the act of adultery were to be stoned to death. Under Roman occupation, however, the Jewish people did not have the authority to execute people; this is cited in John's passion narrative. To answer the Pharisees' question, Jesus must propose an action that will be either contrary to the Law of Moses or contrary to Roman law. The purpose of the question appears to be similar to the question about paying taxes found in Mark 12:13-17. Either answer, yes or no, will support the Pharisees' case against Jesus.

Jesus avoids the trap, however, by offering an answer that was not anticipated by those who posed the question. Jesus, after writing on the ground with his finger, addresses those who stand before him and suggests that the one without sin cast the first stone. Jesus then returns to his writing. This Scripture reading, by the way, is the only evidence we have of Jesus writing. Yet there are no specific details about what he wrote.

Left alone with the woman, Jesus asks where the accusers have gone. With no one remaining to condemn the woman, Jesus (the one who truly is without sin) sends the woman on her way, refusing to pass judgment on her and exhorting her to avoid future sin.

Jesus' response to those who accuse the woman is more than a caution to us about making judgment of others. As sinners, we are all unworthy to judge the sins of others and we would stand convicted by God for our transgressions. Yet Jesus, the one without sin and thus our judge, offers us who are sinners his mercy and forgiveness. Redeemed by Jesus' compassion, we are sent to sin no more and to live in God's love and peace.

Dear Parishioners,

I would like to thank all of you who completed and returned the recent *Faith in Our Future* survey. We are currently tallying and inputting the paper copies, but the initial results are showing an impressive return rate. The next question is: what do we plan to do with the findings?

As I had mentioned in my post-Communion talk two weekends ago, all 107 parishes in the Diocese of Trenton were requested to conduct a poll as part of the Parish self-evaluation phase of the initiative. Based on your responses, the Core Team will be submitting what you have perceived to be both the strengths and the areas needing improvement at Visitation Parish. This will complete this phase of the *Faith in Our Future* initiative as commissioned and outlined by Bishop O'Connell. The next phase, which will run for several months, is to conduct meetings and discussions with the various parish "cohorts" that have been formed by the Diocesan Study Commission. As those who have read the recent edition of the diocesan newspaper *The Monitor* know, we are in Cohort 22. This Cohort includes St. Dominic, St. Mary of the Lake (which encompasses Georgian Court University) and St. Anthony Claret parishes in Lakewood as well as Visitation. Cohort members will share their findings with the other members, using this as basis for discussion and working together in responding to the goals of the initiative as set by the Bishop. They are: (1) Enliven and strengthen our parishes; (2) Explore new models of leadership; (3) Improve our stewardship; (4) Establish collaborative relationships and (5) Provide pastoral ministry to Hispanic Catholics. As the initiative progresses, the Core Team and I will keep you updated.

I ask you to pray for our parish Core Team and our Cohort as we begin this next phase. I know that change can be a challenge and a cause for anxiety. However, I am also confident that, always turning to the Holy Spirit for guidance and strength, trusting in our heavenly Father and working together for the good of God's people, we will work to build a Church ready to meet the needs of the 21st Century and beyond.

LENT INSTRUCTION

The days of **fast and abstinence** are **ASH WEDNESDAY AND GOOD FRIDAY**.

The other **Fridays of Lent** are **DAYS OF ABSTINENCE**.

Those between the ages of eighteen and fifty-nine are obliged to fast. By this obligation, the individual is permitted only one full meal a day.

At the age of fourteen, people are obliged to abstain. This obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat.

Missing abstinence on any one (1) Friday is not a serious sin. Missing abstinence most of the Fridays of Lent (or more than half of them) is a serious sin that needs to be confessed & absolved.

The obligation of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 14, to Trinity Sunday, May 22**. However, the Code of Canon Law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

Ten Steps to Reconciliation

1 Admit and express your feelings. Write them in a journal; talk them out with an impartial friend. Be honest. Say what you want to say. Get it all out.

2 Decide & pray. Forgiveness is not a matter of *feeling*, but of *decision*. The decision to forgive will not automatically change your feelings, but it's a start. Pray for the *desire* to forgive. Pray that the Lord will change *both* hearts. Forgiveness is a process; it takes time. Be generous with your time and your heart.

3 Confess and repent. Focus on *your* sins, not the other persons'. What did I do to contribute to the situation? No one is ever totally innocent. "*It takes two...*" Rid yourself of resentment; it does no good.

4. Let go of fear and anger. Out of fear, our hearts can harden to protect us from further hurt. We delay reconciliation because of fear of rejection. The longer one waits to reconcile, the more anger and resentment grows. *What are you waiting for?* Start the process. (Read and reflect on Psalm 51).

5 Gain a fair perspective. When hurt, our imagination has "a field day." Exaggeration blossoms. Get grounded. Place yourself in the other person's shoes. *Try* to understand.

6 Imagine the meeting. Use your imagination in a positive way. Reflect on what you will say and do. Practice smiling. Imagine that Jesus is in the room with both of you. *What is He asking of you?*

7 Meet with the other person. Reach out. Take a risk. What have you got to lose? Choose a time when neither will feel rushed. Have a positive attitude. Begin the meeting with prayer. Each speak about the experience from your own perspective. Be open to another interpretation. There are always three perspectives: yours, the other person's, and the truth.

8 Give thanks to God. If successful, offer thanks to God. If not, give thanks for the opportunity to put Gospel teachings into practice. Remember, we learn from our failures as well as our successes. Most of the time, there will be a tomorrow.

9 Deepen the reconciliation. The process continues. This initial act of forgiveness will need to be ratified by other acts of kindness. Make plans for the next get-together: dinner, shopping; some activity that will allow for communication.

10 Be patient. Few friendships are established in one setting; they develop over time. Reconciliation takes time, too. Be good to yourself and your friend. Let reconciliation grow and develop. You're both worth it.

WHY DO WE CALL PRIESTS FATHER?

Jesus used the title “father” for several characters in His parables: In the parable of the rich man and the beggar, Lazarus, the rich man, cries out from the depths of Hell, “Father Abraham, have pity on me,” and the usage of the title “father” occurs many times in Luke and the other Gospels and letters. The same is true in the parable of the Prodigal Son: The young prodigal son, upon his return, says, “Father, I have sinned against God and against you” (Lk 15:11-32). Given the way our Lord used the title “father” in so many teachings, including when repeating the fourth commandment, our Lord did not intend to prohibit calling a father by the title “father”; rather, he prohibited misusing the title.

After all we refer to the male person of the parental unit as father and when we think of the authority and responsibilities of our physical fathers we have no problem with calling them father. However, mindfully we use the term we must be conscious of exercising it diligently, humbly and courageously. In a religious sense, those who serve the Lord and represent his authority, as a teacher, parent, protector and especially a guardian deserve, to be called by that title.

When we think of all the Priest represents for us we are confident in our address to him as Father. For he loves us, guides us, teaches us, comforts us, consoles us, presents Jesus to us in so many ways, protects us, chides us and does all those things that a good father does for his children.

The Priest must meet the spiritual needs of those entrusted to his care, providing them with the nourishment of our Lord through the sacraments. He must preach the Gospel with fervor and conviction in accord with the mind of the Church, challenging all to continue on the path of conversion which leads to holiness. He must correct those who have erred, but with mercy and compassion. In the same spirit as the Father with his prodigal son, the Priest must reconcile sinners who have gone astray and help them to seek a way back to God. As a father listens to his child, so must a Priest listen to his spiritual children, providing counsel and consolation. A Priest must also be mindful of the “physical” needs of his flock — food, housing, clothing and education.

All of us must pray for our Priests, especially those who serve in our own parishes and those newly ordained to our diocese, that by God’s grace they may strive to fulfill the responsibility of being called “Father.”

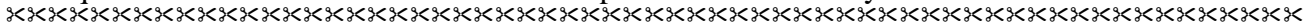
