Sacramental Sponsor Certificates

The following is required by Canon Law to be a Catholic Godparent/Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. 1. Be at least 16 years of age. 2. Have completed the Sacraments of the Initiation. (Baptism, Eucharist & Confirmation) 3. Be a registered and active parishioner living a life of faith. If married, have a marriage that is canonically valid and recognized by the Catholic Church.

Baptism

Parents or legal guardians are encouraged to register 2 months in advance to schedule a baptism. Marriages

The Sacrament of Marriage requires a time of spiritual preparation. According to the Common Policy adopted by the Bishops of New Jersey, this preparation requires sessions with a priest or deacon, Focus review and attendance at a Marriage Preparation Programs such as Pre Cana. Therefore couples should make arrangements with the Church at least 1 year before the planned wedding date and finalizing any social plans. Couples must also verify freedom to marry before dates and arrangements can be made. Please contact Deacon Sal Vicari at ext. 218 to make arrangements.

Reflections for The Twenty Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time



In today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin

and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that Jesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things. But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans. Even when God works wonders through us, with our mustard seed-sized faith, we must not seek praise. Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us—nothing more, nothing less. When we are graced enough to cooperate with God, the work we do is nothing more than our obligation to God as faithful stewards. And yet, our faith enables us to believe that what we have offered in service to God, as his servants, can be made to produce a hundredfold.

Fr. Jim O'Neill*

MOVED BY MERCY

In *The Monitor* you may have seen that Bishop O'Connell has appointed me Respect Life chaplain for Ocean County. I will assist the pro-life groups in Ocean County parishes with any theological needs and celebrate an annual pro-life Mass. Two lay people will chair the meetings and coordinate any joint efforts. We will attend an annual diocesan meeting, and I hope to get back to participating in the March for Life.

Fr. Joe Noche (who was ordained a few seconds before me since "N" comes before "O") is the liaison for the whole diocese as well as the chaplain for Burlington County. He probably recommended me because of my participation in Respect Life activities when I was in Moorestown. We had a number of dedicated laity involved in a Cherry Hill pregnancy resource center and 40 Days for Life. We also joined neighboring parishes for a bus to the March for Life and supported efforts to open a Good Counsel home for women in crisis pregnancies. I was amazed and glad to assist these parishioners who did some wonderful and very merciful work for women, men, and their very young children.

At Visitation, instead of participating in pro-life activities for the very young, I have spent more time anointing the sick and ministering to the dying. Often, there is a need to help with very difficult decisions about medical treatments, discerning whether they are reasonable and required or excessively burdensome and optional.

Whether ministering to the young, the sick, or the old, all of us are called to be merciful. October is Respect Life Month, and today is Respect Life Sunday. The new annual theme for our country starts now: Moved by Mercy. We are to exercise a merciful reverence for life from beginning to end. During this month and throughout the year, may our hearts be moved by God to show mercy to those who are marginalized, ignored, and especially for those whose lives are at risk. How does God want to work through you today?

LIFE IN THE SPIRIT SEMINAR

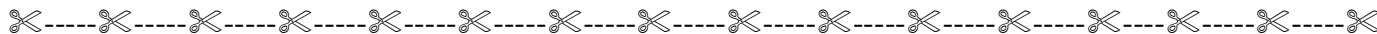

To all of the good people of Visitation,

A major endowment campaign is currently underway at Visitation and throughout the Diocese of Trenton. This week I will be sharing the diocesan components of the *Faith to Move Mountains* Campaign for the Diocese and our parish.

Our Parishes –\$30 Million

A minimum of 30%, or \$22.5 million, of the funds collected at the parish level will remain at the individual parish to address their own local needs. Once a parish has reached its goal, the allocation of funds will reverse and the parish will receive 70% of all additional monies collected. Additional funds will provide an endowment for parishes experiencing critical financial circumstances (**\$7.5 million**).

Ordained Ministry –\$20 Million

- Increase the current endowment for our retired clergy who have dedicated their lives to their parish communities. In the next 10 years alone, 44% of our priests will be eligible for retirement!
- Supplement current and future education costs for our growing class of seminarians, as it costs approximately \$40,000 to educate one seminarian for one year.
- Expand the diaconate program to serve communities requiring excellent homilies, sacramental preparation and spiritual direction.

Catholic Schools –\$15 Million

- Provide additional sponsorships for “seats” at a school reflecting the *total cost* of educating the student, which has risen to nearly \$7,000 each year.
- Support our “Mission Schools,” which serve underprivileged children from ethnically diverse communities with limited access to a quality Catholic education.
- Provide administrative and operational support to continue building the Catholic Alumni Partnership (CAP) program, which has already raised more than \$180,000 for tuition assistance, technology upgrades, and local campus needs since its launch in 2013.

Catechesis and Evangelization – \$5 Million

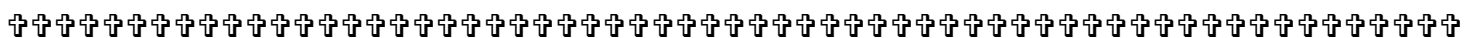
- Provide financial assistance for full certification for all of our catechists and scholarship assistance for parish leaders (DRE’s, Youth Directors, etc.) so that all serving in this role will have or be pursuing a master’s degree in such programs as pastoral theology, ministry, and liturgy.
- Support the organized training of adult formation teams, strengthen existing programs, or create new ones at each parish.
- Build a comprehensive network upon our parish evangelization ministries in order to empower every parish community to deepen the spiritual lives of its people, reach out to those who have left the Church, and welcome all those who are coming to the faith for the first time.

Social Services –\$5 Million

- Award grants to parishes and Catholic Social Service agencies to respond to the increasing needs of those struggling in their communities.
- Provide professional assistance to parishes with a critical need for counseling services among their parishioners suffering from addiction, loss of a loved one, divorce, and other mental health issues.

In the coming weeks, I will share further details about how the campaign funds will directly impact our Diocese and our community here at Visitation. Thank you for your continued prayers and support.

RESPECT LIFE



October is Respect Life month. Pope Francis' command to "open your hearts to life" doesn't simply speak about the attitude we should have on the serious issues of abortion and euthanasia. Rather, to open our hearts to life is to approach every person we meet with an attitude of gratitude. Every person exists because God loves them.

So whether by simply smiling at the person you walk past on the street or stopping to spend time with a loved one who perhaps has no one to care for them, you are asked by God to see the goodness of those around you and to love them by everything you do.

CREATE UNDERSTANDING ABOUT THE CATHOLIC FAITH
