Dear Parishioners.

During this past week we have all been holding in our hearts the victims of the horror that occurred on Morris Park Avenue last Saturday in the midst of a fun-filled afternoon of trick-or-

treating. Our hearts go out to the victims, ten year old Nyanna Aquil, a 5th grader at PS 83, her grandfather, Louis Perez, and 24-year-old Kristian Leka, and to their families who mourn them. There is no sorrow like that of a parent who loses a child. Let us continue to pray for their healing and peace, and for the healing of this Morris Park Community so shaken and broken by this tragedy. Indeed this is a beautiful community, and that beauty was so much on display this week with so many people spontaneously coming together to pray and looking for ways to help. It is at moments like this that we realize how precious life is, how much we need each other, and how much we really do love and care for one another.

The suffering of others brings out the best in us. Whether we know them personally or not, no matter what religion, language or country they may be from, we immediately recognize our common humanity when a tragedy like this strikes. As Pope Saint John Paul II wrote in his beautiful 1984 Apostolic Letter on human suffering: "The sight of suffering in others unleashes love in the human heart. While it may be easy under ordinary circumstances to focus with tunnel vision on our own concerns, when calamities strike, in a sense they strike us all. We then recognize that others have it worse than we do and we are moved to respond with genuine compassion. It is on these tragic occasions that the world becomes more human and that we begin to sense the profound truth that we are all members of the same human family." How true that is here in Morris Park.

Love that is sincere, that comes from the depths of our hearts is what is most pleasing to God. In today's Gospel we hear of a poor widow who put two small coins in the Temple treasury, which was everything she had. Jesus observed her and could see that her gift was truly a sacrifice, given out of genuine love for God. And Jesus pointed out that this was worth infinitely more than the donations of all the others who were giving out of their surplus wealth.

Jesus uses the sacrificial gift of this poor widow to teach us, that what is most pleasing to God is not so much the amount we give, but the love that our gift expresses. This poor widow did not give from her left overs, but gave of her very self. Her gift of self, given out of her love for God, points to the Cross where Jesus would give Himself entirely, all the way down to His last drop of blood, out of love for you and for me. Jesus teaches us by the example of this poor widow and by His own example on the Cross, that the essence of love is sacrifice.

And how beautifully this love has been on display here in the wake of last week's tragedy. May this Community and our beautiful Parish of Saint Francis Xavier always be a place where the Love of Jesus is present and felt by all every day. May God bless us all.
