

Dear Parishioners.

I want to first of all wish everyone a very blessed Thanksgiving Day this Thursday. It is hard to believe that the season of Advent is almost upon us, with Christmas arriving very soon thereafter.

We begin a brand new Liturgical Year with the First Sunday of Advent next week. But first, we crown the end of this year today with this majestic Feast of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. Today we proclaim with the Church throughout the whole world what should be evident in the way we live every day, that Jesus Christ is our King, that He is the beginning, the end, and the center of our entire lives.

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI often spoke of one of the greatest spiritual and moral problems of our time - Relativism. Relativism is the idea that there are no absolute truths that govern what is right and wrong. In our culture today morality has become merely a matter of popular opinion without regard to objective Truth, without regard to the Laws and Commandments of God. It's all part of the air we breathe today. Man, not God, has become the arbiter of what is right and wrong. But that erroneous thinking dates back to original sin when Satan deceived our first parents into thinking that they could become like gods, deciding for themselves what is true, what is good and what is evil. Once we do that, God is no longer God in our lives, and we become our own god. There is only One Truth - Jesus Christ - who is the same yesterday, today, and forever. That is what we proclaim with all our hearts today and every day.

Jesus said to Pontius Pilot in the Gospel today:
"I have come to testify to the Truth. Everyone who belongs to the Truth listens to my voice." Are we listening to the voice of Jesus as He continues to speak to us through His Church, or are we listening to the myriad of other voices and opinions out there? When asked if He is a King, Jesus replied to Pilot: "My Kingdom does not belong to this world." To proclaim Jesus as our King is to recognize that while we are in the world we are not of the world; that we belong to Christ; that our true and lasting Home is not here but in Heaven. Today's Feast of Christ the King calls each of us to consider whether we truly profess Jesus Christ as our King, not only with our words, but in the way we live. Is it the values of Jesus Christ or the values of the world that drives our thoughts, words, and actions?

With a new year of Grace beginning next week on the First Sunday of Advent, let us recommit ourselves to proclaiming to the world that Jesus Christ is our King, that He alone has dominion over our lives, over our minds and our hearts. And as we celebrate Thanksgiving Day this Thursday, let us give thanks to almighty God that we have such a King, who in the words of Saint John Paul II, "...renounces all the signs of power, the instruments of dominion, force and arrogance, and wishes to reign only with the power of truth and love in the interior of our hearts." May God bless us all.


